### India Outlook 2022: Freight rates, box prices continue to rise

Not a happy start to the New Year for exporters and freight forwarders in India and Asia as the volatility of spot rates and contract rates continues to spill over in 2022.


Container prices have risen at most of the major ports in India by at least 12% in January itself because of the Covid-19 Omicron variant that disrupted the global supply chains.

However, market watchers are not putting the burden of rising box rates solely on the corona virus variant but also on the changing purchasing patterns, the Chinese New Year that is around the corner and the restocking of supplies that followed due to the rising number of Covid-19 cases in China.



Bhavik Mota, Maersk's director of ocean management in West & Central Asia, told *Container News* that the dynamics of the global trade are based on the dynamics of the pandemic.

"We do not want to guess when and how the situation will change. The current Omicron outbreak is a classic example of the events turning all the time. Without it, we may have been moving faster towards normalization.

## **20-ft Container rates - Comparison between December 2021 and January 2022**

The turnaround time of a container at the major ports in China has increased due to the rising number of cases along with the suspension of trucking activities in most parts of the country. Additionally, there is severe congestion at ports in the United States and the United Kingdom.

Mota said that the current level of freight rates is a reflection or consequence of the disruptions in the market that are partially driven by the exceptional demand situation in the US and Europe.

With several states implementing night and weekend curfew, there has been a production loss of up to 25%. Prices of metals and plastics rose by 70%. Semi-conductors that are used in making a product have also become costlier.

Manufacturers Association (CEAMA) has said that the industry may hike the prices of home electronics and appliances like washing machines by 5% to 7%. Panasonic, LG and Haier have already revised their prices upwards

Indian exporters of basmati rice, tea and leather goods have raised concerns over the rising prices. Tea exporters in India feel the freight rates may not soften anytime soon. In the last 15 days, the freight rates of exporting tea to places like Iran and Kazakhstan have shot up by US\$500 to US\$1,000 per box.

The exporters feel that the soaring rates will trickle down to consumers eventually if not controlled. Prices of air conditioners and refrigerators have already risen due to the high cost of raw materials and ever-soaring freight rates. Consumer Electronics and Appliances Manufacturers Association (CEAMA) has said that the industry may hike the prices of home electronics and appliances like washing machines by 5% to 7%. Panasonic, LG and Haier have already revised their prices upwards

### Global Logistics 2022: Is this the new normal

Global supply chain disruptions, port congestion, capacity shortages, increasing ocean freight rates and an ongoing pandemic have challenged shippers, ports, carriers and logistics providers during the past year.

And looking ahead in 2022, experts estimate that the pressure on global supply chains will continue—and the light at the end of the tunnel is not to be expected until the second half of the year at the earliest.

Above all, the consensus is that the pressure on the ocean freight market will continue in 2022, and freight rates are unlikely to fall back to pre-COVID levels. Capacity problems and congestion in the ports will continue to combine with strong global demand in the consumer goods sector.

German economist Monika Schnitzer expects that the current Omicron variant will have further impact on global shipping times in the coming months. "This could exacerbate the already existing delivery bottlenecks," she warns. "Shipping times from China to the United States have already increased from 85 days to 100 days due to the Delta variant, and that could increase again. Europe is also affected by these problems, as the situation remains tense."

In the meantime, the ongoing pandemic has prompted logiams at leading ports on the U.S. West Coast and in China, meaning that hundreds of container vessels are waiting at sea for a berth. At the beginning of this year, Maersk warned its customers that the waiting time for container vessels to discharge or pick up cargoes at the Port of Long Beach near Los

Looking to China, fears are growing that recent Omicron breakouts will lead to further port shutdowns. As reported by the state broadcaster CCTV in January, the port of Tianjin was locked down after the local outbreak of Omicron—less than a month before the start of the winter Olympics in nearby Beijing. Chinese authorities temporarily locked down the ports of Yantian and Ningbo last year.

The restrictions resulted in delays for truck drivers moving loaded and empty containers between factories and the port, and the interruptions in production and transportation caused delays in exporting and returning empty containers to factories overseas.

In Europe's largest seaport, the Port of Rotterdam, congestion is seen as persisting through 2022 as well. Although vessels are not currently waiting outside Rotterdam, storage capacities are limited and the European hinterland connections are not running smoothly

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# Indospace to invest Rs 600 crore in two logistics parks in Gujarat

The two parks are spread over 90 acres with around 2 million sq ft of warehousing space
