From the Vice-Chancellor

Dear Readers,

Chidambaram took part in the function. Further, the grand celebration of 76th Republic Day happened with the enthusiastic participation of faculty, students and administrative staff. I had the privilege of hoisting the national flag and delivering the Republic Day Address. The Directorate of Physical Education, Alagappa University in association with the Association of Indian Universities held the prestigious All India Inter University Ball-Badminton Women's Tournament for four days from March 29, 2025. Initiation of an Ultra-Modern Library

Mrs. LAKSHMI VALAR TAMIL LIBRARY INAUGURATED ON THE CAMPUS



Alagappa University witnessed the grand inauguration of an ultra-modern library constructed at an estimated cost of Rs. 12 crores. It was declared open by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Thiru M.K. Stalin on the Alagappa University Campus, on 21st January 2025 in the presence of the donor Thiru. P. Chidambaram, the former Finance Minister, Government of India and his son Mr. Karti P Chidambaram, Member of Parliament, Sivagangai Constituency. The Chief Minister also unveiled a statue of Ayyan Thiruvalluvar at the entrance of the Administrative Building of the University.

The Mrs. Lakshmi Valar Tamil Library equipped with all ultra-modern facilities, constructed in memory of Mrs. Lakshmi Ammal, mother of P. Chidambaram, was donated to the University by the Former Union Finance Minister.

At the subsequent function held in the Convocation Hall, the Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, Prof. G. Ravi, delivered the welcome address and highlighted the University's achievements in the recent years and thanked the donor for his gracious philanthropy.

Mr. P. Chidambaram, in his introductory speech, reminisced about his mother's profound influence on him through her knowledge of Tamil and English, which instilled in him a deep passion for both the languages. He expressed his thanks to his wife and family members for their unstinted support in constructing and donating the library building. Emphasizing the need for Tamil to thrive in all domains-mathematics, computer science, law, medicine, agriculture, management, engineering, and research-he envisioned the library as a world-class center

for Tamil studies and a dynamic hub for creation and innovation. He added that Tamil Language should be made a modern effective tool for the intellectual progress of Tamil speakers worldwide. He also acknowledged the contributions of donors of books; and thanked Mr. Shiv Nadar and his daughter for their donation of computers to the library.

Renowned Tamil Poet Kavi Perarasu Vairamuthu, expressed his admiration for Mr. P. Chidambaram whose dedication to Tamil Language could be seen through this remarkable initiative. He remarked that among the great ancient civilizations Sumerian Civilization was considered supreme as there were clear references to the existence of libraries in that civilization. He noted that India, currently ranked fifth in book publishing industry globally, should aspire to surpass China which ranks first in publishing industry. Stressing the importance of printed books over e-books that cause health hazards, he exhorted the reading community to go in for printed books. He urged Tamil scholars, students, and the broader intellectual community to make full use of this monumental facility that would stand as a pillar of wisdom in a technology-driven world.

The Minister for Higher Education and Pro-Chancellor of Alagappa University Mr. Govi. Chezhiyaan highlighted Tamil Nadu's leading position in higher education and elaborated on the incentives and welfare schemes implemented by the State Government to promote higher education in the state.

Delivering the keynote address, the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Mr. M.K. Stalin, lauded Alagappar's legacy of philanthropy and commitment to education and Tamil development. He praised Mr. P. Chidambaram for his generous donation, emphasizing its significance for future generations. He encouraged people with philanthropic mind to establish libraries in their villages to foster education. The Chief Minister also detailed various State initiatives to promote higher education that positioned Tamil Nadu as a pioneer for other States. He urged the youth to embrace the progressive ideals of Valluvar and Vallalar, who propagated the high ethics of evolving an egalitarian society. He proudly noted that Tamil Nadu houses 31 out of the top 100 higher education institutions in India, including state universities, engineering, and medical colleges. He further referred to specialised training programmes offered with financial incentives, for students from underprivileged classes to prepare for

competitive exams like IAS, IPS, and other prestigious state services.

A compendium containing articles presented at the National Conference conducted to mark Kalaignar Karunanithi's Birth Centenary Celebrations was released by the Chief Minister and the first copy was received by the Vice-Chancellor. Another book titled Thiru M.K. Stalin Pillai Tamil written by Annadasan was released by Thiru. P. Chidambaram and the first copy was received by Prof. G. Ravi.

A Note on the Structural Design of Lakshmi Valar Tamil Noolagam

The ground floor of the library measuring a constructed area of 19200 square foot accommodates a vast reading hall, a conference hall, an internet centre, a store room, two rest rooms one for men's use and another for women's use and also a specially designed rest room for the use of persons with disabilities. The first floor has a constructed area of 11,800 square foot. It accommodates two spacious reading halls, a study room for research scholars, a conference hall besides two rest rooms and a special toilet for the exclusive use of persons with disabilities.

Architect of the Constitution Remembered

GRAND 76TH REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATIONS

உலகில் அறிவு இரட்டிப்பு (Knowledge Doubling) என்ற ஒரு கோட்பாடு உண்டு. அதாவது 1940ஆவது ஆண்டுக்குப் பிறகு இந்தக் கோட்பாடு தோற்றம் பெற்றது. அந்த ஆண்டிலிருந்து மானுட அறிவு இரட்டிப்பாகிக் கொண்டே வருகிறது என்று கணக்கிட்டனர். பட்மன்ஸர் புல்லர் என்பவர் எழுதிய தி கிரிட்டிகல் பார்ட் என்னும் நூல் 1982ஆம் ஆண்டு வெளிவந்தது. இந்நூல் இந்தக் கோட்பாட்டை மேலும் ஆராய்ந்து 1900லிருந்து தொடங்கிய இவ்வறிவு இரட்டிப்பு 1945இல் ஒரு மடங்காயிற்று என்று சுட்டியது. அதன்பின்னர் இது பதினைந்து ஆண்டுகளுக்கு

ஒரு முறையாக மாறிற்று. 2020க்குப் பிறகு இந்த அறிவு இரட்டிப்பின் வேகம் 12 மணிநேரத்திற்கு ஒருமுறை என்றாகியிருக்கிறது. இத்தனை வேகமாக இந்த உலகம் அறிவியலில் வளர்ந்து வருகிறது.

இத்தனை அறிவியல் வசதிகளைக் கொண்டு நாம் தமிழின் தொன்மையைத் துல்லியமாக ஆராய்தல் அறிவியல் வளர்ச்சியோடு தமிழையும் வேண்டும். இணைத்துக் கற்க வேண்டும். பிற துறையறிவினையும் தமிழோடு இணைத்துக் கொள்ளுதல் வேண்டும். அதற்கு நிறையக் கேளுங்கள். அவ்வகையில் ஏனைய துறைகளை விடவும் தமிழ்த்துறை சிறப்புற வேண்டும் குறிப்பிட்டார். இவ்விழாவில் திருநெல்வேலி மனோன்மணியம் சுந்தரனார் பல்கலைக்கழகத்தின் தமிழியல்துறைத் தலைவரும் பேராசிரியருமான ஞா. ஸ்டீபன், "காத்தவராயன் கதைப் பாடல்கள் – இந்திய இலங்கை வடிவங்கள்" என்ற தலைப்பில் சிறப்புரையாற்றினார். அவர் தனது உரையில், நாட்டுப்புறவியல் வரலாற்றில் குறிப்பிடத்தக்கவர் பேராசிரியர் முனைவர் அ. அறிவுநம்பி ஆவார். தமிழ்நாட்டில் பாளையங்கோட்டைப் பகுதி நாட்டுப்புறவியலாளர்கள் நிறைந்ததாகும்.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

International Webinar on Inspiring Teaching

The Department of English and Foreign Languages of Alagappa University, Karaikudi held an International Webinar on Inspiring Teaching on February 2025 with emeritus Professor of Education, Dr. Pamela

Sammons from University of Oxford, England as the resource person. Prof. Pamela Sammons began her virtual discourse stating that the future of a nation is determined only in its class rooms. She went on to state that teachers are not just teaching professionals but the architects of a nation. Her other viewpoints included that teachers should continue to fortify and strengthen their intellectual resources and they cannot afford to have complacency. With their constantly renewed, revived and fortified knowledge when teachers educate their pupils, it would have huge impact upon the learners. The former Oxonian Professor of Education further illustrated that the teaching fraternity needs to evolve itself into a body of lifelong learners who should make the learners realise that learning is a continuous process. Prof. Pamela Sammons made a reference to Emerson's dream of American Scholar whom he expects to be a man thinking and she urged the faculty to ensure that students become creative, innovative and untraditional contemplators. She further made the point that if students merely re-present what the teachers have already represented, it would do them only little good. Students by making use of the lessons taught in the class room, should analyse, examine and inquire into them. Then they should come out with their own insights into the subjects and present their own perceptions of them, she added. Over and above, it is very vital and essential for the academia to ascertain the existence of an effective and impressive learner-centric environment in the educational institutions. Prof. Pamela Sammons said further that only when the teachers encourage the learners not to remain passive but to actively participate in class room discussions by seeking clarifications for their doubts, raising questions and providing their own ideas, students can be transformed into successful as well as resourceful individuals. The attendees included the faculty, research scholars and postgraduate students of the University and affiliated colleges.

Earlier, Prof. P. Madhan, Head of the Department of English, delivered the welcome address. Dr. M. Natarajan former member of the Senate made technological arrangement and coordinated the event. Prof. Nagarajan, Principal, Government College of Arts and Science, Eriyur in Dharmapuri District offered felicitations. In the end Dr. S. Valliammai, Assistant Professor, proposed a formal vote of thanks.

International Webinar on Shakespearean Tragedies

An International Webinar on Shakespearean Tragedies was conducted on February 26, 2025, by the Department of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa

University, Karaikudi. The event brought together scholars and academicians to explore Shakespeare's tragic works' timeless relevance and depth.Dr. P. Madhan, Professor and Head of the Department of English and Foreign Languages, delivered the welcome address and introduced the distinguished chief guest. The session was further enriched by the felicitation address delivered by Dr. V. Nagarajan, Principal, Government Arts and Science College, Eriyur, Dharmapuri District who highlighted the enduring significance of Shakespearean tragedies in theatrical performance, literature and culture.

The highlight of the webinar was the special lecture delivered by Dr. Charlette Scott, Professor of English at Goldsmiths, University of London, England. Dr. Scott, a renowned Shakespearean scholar, provided profound insights into the thematic depth, character complexities, and philosophical dimensions of Shakespeare's tragedies. She emphasized how these works continue to resonate with modern audiences by addressing fundamental human emotions such as ambition, fate, guilt, and redemption. Her lecture also shed light on Shakespeare's dramatic techniques, the political undertones in his plays, and the influence of Elizabethan theatre traditions on his tragic narratives. The session sparked an engaging discussion among participants, enhancing their understanding of Shakespearean dramaturgy.

The webinar witnessed the active participation of faculty members, including Dr. R. Rajan Ganapathy, Dr. G. Somasundaram, and Dr. N. Kanvitha, Assistant Professors of English at Alagappa Government Arts College. Their insightful discussions contributed significantly to the academic discourse.

The event concluded with a formal vote of thanks proposed by Dr. S. Valliammai, Assistant Professor of English, expressing appreciation to all the participants, speakers, and organizing members for their valuable contributions to the successful conduct of the webinar. The webinar served as an intellectual platform for scholars and students to engage in meaningful discussions on Shakespeare's tragedies, reaffirming the Bard's unparalleled influence on world literature.

World Poetry Day Celebrations - 2025

The Department of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa University, Karaikudi, organized an International Seminar on Poetry as part of the World Poetry Day celebrations on March 21, 2025. The event featured insightful discussions on the evolution of poetry and its thematic diversity across different literary periods.



Delivering the welcome address and thematic speech, Dr. P. Madhan, Professor and Head of the Department, traced the history of poetry from the Anglo-Saxon period to the present age, highlighting various themes explored across eras. He referenced the poetical compositions of Geoffrey Chaucer, Percy Bysshe Shelley, T.S. Eliot, Matthew Arnold, and others, emphasizing their contributions to literary tradition. Dr. Madhan noted that the publication of Lyrical Ballads marked the beginning of the Romantic Movement, a period that revolutionized poetry by celebrating emotion, imagination, and nature. He highlighted how poetry serves as a testament to human experience, capturing themes such as ethos, spirituality, nature, and social justice.

He also underscored the religious and spiritual significance of poetry, pointing out that Saivite and Vaishnavite traditions in Tamil literature worshipped God through poetic compositions. Quoting the powerful poem of Maya Angelou's "Still I Rise", he articulated the struggles of marginalized communities and the resilience expressed through poetry. Dr. Madhan further illustrated the beauty of nature in poetry, referring to William Wordsworth's "Tintern Abbey", where the poet reflects on his past and present while immersing himself in nature's tranquillity, portraying nature as a motherly presence. He also evoked the timeless lines of Kaniyan Poongundranar's Yathum Oore Yavarum Kelir, emphasizing its universal relevance due to its poetic form. Concluding his speech, he referenced Robert Frost's "Stopping by Woods on a Snowy Evening", interpreting its central message as a reminder to stay focused on one's goals without distraction.

Dr. R.C. Sheila Royappa, Former Professor of English, Seethalakshmi Achi College for Women, Pallathur, delivered the Inaugural Address, providing valuable insights into the significance of World Poetry

Day. She explained the role of UNESCO, which has been observing World Poetry Day since 1999 to celebrate poetry as a universal art form that promotes linguistic diversity and cultural exchange. The theme for this year's celebration, "Safety, Security, and Peace," highlights the power of poetry in fostering harmony and resilience in society. Dr. Royappa traced the evolution of poetry, discussing Metaphysical Poetry, Romantic Poetry, and Victorian Poetry, illustrating each movement with representative works. She emphasized that poetry is not just about recognizing poets but also about paying tribute to the art form itself, as it has the ability to transform an individual's personality by nurturing creativity, introspection, and emotional depth.

She made a special reference to Emily Dickinson's poem "Because I Could Not Stop for Death", explaining that the poem presents death not as something to be feared, but as an inevitable transition-a realization that brings acceptance. She also discussed the works of Andrew Marvell, John Donne, Rabindranath Tagore, Sarojini Naidu, and Nissim Ezekiel, highlighting their contributions to poetry and its enduring impact. Additionally, she referred to the Bible, emphasizing its poetic significance in conveying profound spiritual truths. In conclusion, Dr. Royappa stressed that the purpose of poetry is to enhance creativity and imagination. She urged students to refine their pronunciation, accent, and intonation (PAI principle) to develop a deeper appreciation for poetry and its expressive potential.

Dr. S. Murugesan, Former Professor of Tamil, Alagappa Government Arts College, Karaikudi, delivered the Keynote Address. He offered profound insights into the theme and form in the composition of poetry. He elaborated on the essential components of poetry, identifying key elements such as theme or message, freedom of expression, imagination, and form or structure. He delved deeply into Puthukavithai (Modern Poetry) and Marabukkavithai (Traditional Poetry), examining their stylistic differences and thematic richness. Dr. Murugesan emphasized that poetry serves as a medium of intellectual and emotional refinement. He urged students to seek out thought-provoking poetry, read it with contemplation, and embrace its transformative power, as poetry has the ability to purify the mind and elevate the soul.

Dr.S.Sudha, Assistant Professor of English, proposed a formal vote of thanks at the Inaugural function. While delivering the presidential Address at the Valedictory function, Prof. A. Senthilrajan, Registrar of Alagappa University, highlighted the role of poetry in fostering linguistic diversity, cultural exchange, and human expression. He recalled UNESCO's 1999 declaration of World Poetry Day and emphasized poetry's power in shaping emotions, thoughts, and society. Quoting renowned poets like Shelley, Byron, Keats, and Frost, he reflected on poetry's artistic depth and universal appeal.

Addressing the literary richness of Tamil poetry, he praised the enduring impact of poets like Bharathiyar, Bharathidasan, Kannadasan, and Vairamuthu, whose verses continue to inspire generations. He encouraged students to engage with poetry, either by composing their own or sharing meaningful verses, reinforcing the timeless relevance of poetic expression. As part of the celebrations, poetry writing competitions in Tamil and English were conducted earlier. The Registrar issued certificates to the prize winners and also presented certificates to the best paper presenters of the seminar.

The International Seminar on Poetry concluded with a thought-provoking valedictory address by Prof. Helen Fulton, Professor of Medieval Literature, University of Bristol, England. Prof. Fulton highlighted the significance of 19th-century medievalism and its profound influence on literature and visual arts. She discussed key works, including The Last Sleep of Arthur in Avalon by Edward Burne-Jones, The Lady of Shalott by John William Waterhouse, and King Arthur by Charles Ernest Butler. She further elaborated on Alfred Tennyson's works, particularly Morte d'Arthur and Guinevere, analyzing their thematic depth through selected extracts. She also explored the "Idylls of the King," emphasizing the role of women as the moral compass and spiritual inspiration in Arthurian legends. At the end, Dr.S. Valliammi, Assistant Professor of English, Proposed Vote of thanks.

Seminar on "Integral Humanism and Its Contribution to Women's Development"

Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Chair, Alagappa University, in association with Women's Studies, Alagappa University, organised a Seminar on "Integral Humanism and Its Contribution to Women's Development

on 12th Feb 2025 at Mary Wollstonecraft Hall. The aim of this programme was to create an awareness about the philosophy of Pt. Deendayal Upadhyay and to highlight his contribution for women's development and nation as well.



In his welcome address, Prof. B. Dharmalingam, Chair Professor, made a reference to the philosophy of Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay which focussed on the promotion of cultural nationalism, decentralization and participatory governance. He pointed out that seventy years ago Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay opposed the Western Capitalist ideas by framing the Integral Humanism that focused on creating a just and inclusive society. He concluded his speech by emphasizing the application of the philosophy of Integral Humanism for building a very strong and prosperous India.

Dr.M. Jothi Basu, Controller of Examinations, delivered the presidential address and highlighted that in India there are four Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay Chairs functioning and one among them functions effectively in Alagappa University. He said that Integral Humanism is a set of concepts drafted by Upadhyaya that combines the ideals of socialism and Gandhian principles such as Sarvodaya (progress of all) and Swadeshi (selfsufficiency). He said that the western philosophy is in the line with of Charles Darwin's theory of "Survival of the Fittest" and in contrast the Integral Humanism focuses on the development of each individual in the country. He stated that UNO is now emphasizing all institutions and organizations to adopt the concept of inclusiveness for the holistic development of a nation, but 70 years ago it was promoted by Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay in India. He referred to the Indian Government's initiatives such as Swadhar Greh Scheme, Ujjawala Scheme, Working Women's Hostel, Mahila Sakthi Kendra Scheme, Mission Sakthi and Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandana Yojana that lay stress on women's development in all spheres.

Prof. J. Sujathamalini, Head, Department of Special Education and Rehabilitation Science, in her inaugural address, stated that Upadhyay emphasized the significance of social harmony and unity. He envisioned a society where mutual respect and cooperation among different communities would lead to a harmonious and integrated national identity. She urged the students to follow the three principles: building of human values, self - understanding and utilization of opportunities that promote Integral Humanism for one's own development and nation as well.

Dr. R. Gayatri, Educationist & Registrar, Pandey School of Journalism, Chennai, delivered the special address and elaborated the life history of Upadhyay. She explained various approaches found in Integral Humanism such as Holistic Approach, Feministic Approach, Power Distribution, Economic Inclusion, Community Development and Women-Led Development Approach. These approaches are dedicated to the welfare of all citizens, and institutions that serve the common good. Finally, she highlighted the government initiatives such as Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana, Jal Jeevan Mission, Ujjwala Scheme, etc. that promote the welfare of women and children.

International Women's Day 2025 Celebrated



The Department of Women's Studies organised the International Women's Day 2025 on 7th March 2025 at L.CT.L. Palaniappa Chettiar Memorial Auditorium. The UN theme of the celebrations was "For All Women and Girls: Rights, Equality, Empowerment."

Prof. G. Ravi, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address highlighted the significance of observing the International Women's Day with the well-chosen theme that focus on the efforts for promoting gender equality and empowerment for creating a gender fair and equitable world. He said that the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) of higher education in Tamil Nadu is 52%, which is almost double the national average. This achievement was due to the equal contribution of girl students. Further he stated that societies where women are given equal respect have flourished; and developed countries can be cited as examples. He also hinted that the adoption and enforcement of laws should be strict and severe for solving social problems faced by women and girls and to prevent such occurrences.

In her inaugural address, Ms. R. Uma Chandrika, Assistant Director, MSME, Madurai branch, elaborated the activities of MSME that promote start-ups among women and youth population. She elaborated the services such as free consultation, assistance in procuring raw materials and sales and marketing services rendered by the MSME and urged the students to disseminate this information for the needy people and to utilize them for their development and nation as well. She exhorted the audience to follow three concepts that empower women and girls: "Saying No" which helps to set boundaries, prioritize self-care, and make choices that align with our values; "financial freedom" for women to make choices and manage finances without relying on others; and "make the money worth for you" that is investing money for selfreliance, security, and to have a more fulfilling life. She concluded her speech by highlighting that personality is characterized by a positive attitude, self-confidence, and a willingness to take action and not by physical characteristics.

Thamizh Semmal Kavingnar Geevee, Patimandra Naduvar, in his special address, highlighted that the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 aimed to increase the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) in higher education to 50% by 2035. It can be achieved by promoting gender parity and breaking the barriers that inhibits women and girls in accessing higher education. He stated that women should underscore their importance and should build courage, self confidence and pool their efforts for their

own progress, family and nation. He exhorted the students to energise themselves with positive attitude and exhibit their full potential for promoting gender fair society. He referred to women like Mother Teresa, Savithri Bai Phule etc, and said that they are such great examples of the power and greatness that a woman carries; and he concluded his speech by asking them to imbibe the taste of success from successful women from various fields.

Dr.P.Veeramani, Head i/c, Dept. of Women's Studies, welcomed the gathering and Dr.R.Portia, Director, Centre for Women's Studies proposed a vote of thanks. Above 400 participants from various schools, colleges and SHG members participated in the programme.

The book narrates how, during a severe famine in Kanchipuram, Aadhikilavan, an agriculturist under the

intuitive "command" of Kanchivana Karuppan, carried the Sami Petti (sacred chest) on his head and migrated with his cattle to the Pandya Kingdom, eventually settling in Kandangipatti near Sivagangai. The manuscript details the divine guidance and blessings received from his clan deity, Kanchivana Karuppan, which the scrivener, Dr. N.R.K. Kalaiyarasan, has meticulously documented in the book form. The Vice-Chancellor also congratulated the staff of the Management Information System (MIS) of the University for making it available as an e-book.

The event commenced with a welcome address and an introduction to the book by Dr. M. Jothi Basu, Controller of Examinations of Alagappa University. Prof. S.
