The Honourable President's Video Conferencing Address on "Youth and Nation-Building"

Alagappa University, Karaikudi, made connectivity arrangements with the Rashtrapati Bhavan to see the Video Conferencing Address by the Honourable President of India on the topic "Youth and Nation-Building" on 19th January 2016 at the Seminar Hall of the University Convocation Auditorium for the benefit of the faculty members and students, as per the directions of the Officer on Special Duty to the President of India, Rashtrapati Bhavan.

150 institutions across the country were selected for this purpose. Out of the Central Universities, IITs and other Academic Institutions, Alagappa University is the only State University selected for this conference.

In his video conferencing address, the Honourable President of India said that India is a nation with a significant youth population. Over six hundred million people in our country are below the age of 25 years. They have boundless energy and potential to innovate new technologies for the rapid growth of the country. Investment in educating the youth, in the sharpening of their mental faculties, technical skills, professional competence and awareness about their social responsibilities, would be the key to prepare them for nation-building. The way we nurture our youth into confident, capable and committed citizens will determine our country's future.

Further, he stated that the youth should shoulder the responsibility of nation-building. They must be prepared for it through the medium of education and training. "The education we impart to our youth must have three clearly-defined goals i.e. to control their lives through character- building, to understand their life through the study of science, religion, history and philosophy and to enjoy their

lives through friendships and relationships. Our education system must gear up to develop our youth on these lines".

The video conferencing address by the Hon'ble President of India took place for an hour between 12.30 and 1.30 p.m.

Prof.S.Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, Prof.V.Balachandran Registrar i/c., Prof.S.Karutha Pandian Syndicate Member, Prof.P.Subas Chandra Bose, Senate Member, Faculty Members and Students of University Departments participated in this event. International Conference on Thirukkural



The inaugural function of a Three-day International Conference on Thirukkural was held on 7.1.2016 at the L.C.T.L. Palaniappa Chettiar Memorial Auditorium, Alagappa University, Karaikudi. This conference was organized jointly with Sree Sevugan Annamalai College, Devakottai, World Thirukural Forum, Kundrakudi, New Century Book House Pvt. Ltd., Chennai, World Cultural Tamil Movement, Pudukottai, Malaysian Tamil Literary Organization, Malaysia and Jamia Trust, Singapore.

Prof.S.Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, presided over the function. In his address, he said that Thirukkural known as

Ulaga Pothumarai is one of the remarkable works in Tamil language. It is an ethical work that clearly explains the way in which human race should lead a meaningful life. Thiruvalluvar has spelt out that the world will flourish only with the increasing presence of men of nobility. He advised that it is not an achievement for students to mug up all the 1330 couplets of Thirukkural, but they must follow at least one couplet for leading their life.

Further, he added that the University has proposed to establish a Centre for Thiruvalluvar Studies at Alagappa University shortly for the purpose of conducting Seminars, Conferences, Workshops and Lectures relating to Thirukkural and also to propagate the importance of Thirukkural to all parts of the country and abroad and to recognize the services of eminent Tamil scholars who have contributed significantly by giving best translations and commentaries on various aspects of Thirukkural. It is also proposed to establish a Tamil Cultural Centre shortly in the University to highlight the values enshrined in Tamil culture and ethos for the benefit of younger generations.



Thavathiru Kundrakudi Ponnambala Adigalar, in his special address, highlighted the uniqueness of Thirukkural and Thiruvalluvar. He said that the greatness of Thirukkural is that it always unites people belonging to different sections and different countries and it will not

divide people. Many have offered commentaries through words on Thirukkural but Vallal Alagappa Chettiar is a noble philanthropist who followed the path of generosity as exemplified in Thirukkural to attain immortality. Further, he said that education is the only means to solve all types of problems in life. It is knowledge that erases ignorance of human beings. Thirukkural is the basic source to transform the mindset of the people. Thiruvalluvar has shown all the ideals of human life. Students should try to imbibe the new ideals to shine in their life following the examples of Dr. U.V. Swaminathalyer and T.P. Meenakshi Sudaram Pillai. Life is not just about acquisition of wealth but life should be meaningful. Reading of Thirukkural helps to eradicate the defects of human life. Pongal is a festival of thanks giving in Tamil culture. We have to enrich the agricultural activities by encouraging the farming community. We must be true to ourselves and the mind should go in that direction. He said that everyone should read Thirukkural every day for their personal and professional betterment.

Research articles of this conference included in three compendia were released by Thavathiru Kundrakudi Adigalar; and Dr. R. Vimalan, Ministry of Education, Singapore, received the volumes.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH AND FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Two-day Lecture on Western Literary Criticism



The Department of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa University organized a Two-day lecture on Western Literary Criticism. Former Head of the Department of English, Madura College Prof. M. Vethapureeswaran was the resource person. In his lecture, he traced the history of Western Literary Criticism from Plato to Jacques Derrida, the French Literary Critic. Prof. M. Vethapureeswaran on his first day lecture spoke upto the period of T.S. Eliot. Regarding Plato, he illustrated that at first he was not in favour

of poets whom he wanted to drive away from his Republic on the ground that they poisoned the minds of the youth. The speaker went on to explicate that later on realizing the significance of poets, he allowed them in. He made extensive references to Horace, other pioneer literary critics Longinus and Quintillion. Having completed his lecture on classical literary critics, Prof. M. Vethapureeswaran turned his attention to English Criticism, the forerunner of which was Philip Sidney whose work *An Apology for Poetry* laid the foundation for English Criticism. He exemplified that according to Philip Sidney, poetry is superior to history and philosophy on the ground that history is dealing with the lives of few individuals and philosophy is a non-concrete and abstract subject. Then the speaker shed light on the critical ideas of Alexander Pope who says that if the deterioration has taken place in creative and critical activities, it is difficult to say which is more poisonous. It was Alexander Pope, Prof. M. Vethapureeswaran added, who said that proper study of mankind is man. Then he proceeded to throw light on Dryden who stated it is very difficult to distinguish between Milton and Shakespeare because both of them are equally sound. Then the speaker went on to highlight the critical ideas of Romantic Age critics, Wordsworth and Coleridge. Having thrown light on the critics of Romantic Age, the speaker referred to Matthew Arnold's critical ideas that find expression in his "The Study of Poetry" in which he speaks about historical fallacy, personal fallacy and touch-stone method. After that Prof. M. Vethapureeswaran made references to T.S. Eliot's ideas of criticism. He stated that T.S. Eliot is for striking a balance between tradition and modernity. Then he moved on to structuralism which gives importance to concrete meanings of words but post-structuralism talks about instability and indeterminacy of languages and text. In the

beginning Dr.P. Madhan, Head i/c, delivered the welcome address. Finally, Dr. Valliammai, Assistant Professor of English proposed a vote of thanks. Visiting Professors Dr. L. Thirunavukkarsu and Dr. Antonysamy participated.

Special Lecture Programme on French and Tamil Languages and Cultures



The Department of English organised a two-day Special Lecture Programme on Tamil and French Languages and Cultures and Prof. S. Sachchithanantham of the International Institute of Higher Studies, Paris, delivered the lectures. Dr. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, who presided over the inaugural session, described the distinguished speaker as a scholar par excellence and an eminent linguist and a remarkable polyglot and referred to his passion for research. Dr. P. Madhan, Head i/c, welcomed the gathering earlier. Before delving deep into the topic of his speech Dr. Sachchithanantham referred to the inextricable inter-relatedness of French and English Languages since the days of William the Conqueror who invaded England in 1066. He made interesting observations about some of the French words that have come into Tamil language through English. He dwelt on the etymology of certain words and also on the nuances of the grammatical structures of both the languages.

Series of Guest Lectures



Dr. G. Rajasekaran, Professor of English (Retired), Annamalai University, gave a series of lectures to the students of Alagappa University on 24th and 25th February 2016. He began his speech by referring to the permanent values of Shakespeare's plays. He said that Shakespeare's genius could be seen not only in the art of characterization but also in the diction, the poetry and the humour of speeches. He exhorted the students to read the plays twice, once rapidly for the story and then a second time for plot structure, characterization and other elements. In the second lecture he dwelt at length on the dominant features of Shakespeare's history plays. Then in the third lecture he made a detailed analysis of the play Henry IV Part-I and referred to the two sides of the play – a serious side and a humorous side. Dwelling on the humorous side the scholar referred to Shakespeare's immortal creation Falstaff whom he described as "a marvellous congregation of charms and vices". He illustrated how enjoyment of life is the keynote of all Falstaff's actions. A perennial liar without malice, he has only contempt for public opinion and does not care for honour. Referring to the other character Hotspur he said that Hotspur represents the serious side of the play. He is a symbol of valour and determination and stands for love of honour and truth and is ready to sacrifice his life for the sake of honour. On the second day the distinguished speaker focussed his lectures on Indian English Drama and made a

detailed explication of Girish Karnad's popular play Tughlaq and made a mention of various modern techniques employed by the playwright. Dr. P. Madhan, Associate Professor and Head i/c, welcomed the scholar earlier and Dr. M. Natarajan, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

ACT NEXT – 2015 (Alagappa Celebrates Themed Nobel Excellence Talks – 2015)



The Department of English and Foreign Languages organized a programme 'ACT Next – 2015' (Alagappa Celebrates Themed Nobel Excellence Talks – 2015) on 16.03.16 at Alagappa University Convocation Seminar Hall. Dr. P. Madhan, Associate Professor and Head i/c., Dept. of English and Foreign Languages, welcomed the gathering. Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, presided over the programme. Dr. M. Selvam, Professor and Head, Dept. of International Business and Commerce, offered his felicitations and he spoke briefly about the Nobel Prize awardee Svetlana. Dr. S. Ganesan, Associate Professor, Dept. of English, The H.H. Rajah's College, Pudukkottai, delivered the Special Address and referred to the contribution of Svetlana to modern Journalism and Literature. He dwelt at length on the Nobel Prize winner's life and works; he started his speech with the words of Charles Dickens 'It was the best of times, it was the worst of times' from The Tale of Two Cities. He spoke about

the contents of the four books of Svetlana, which helped her to get the award. He concluded his speech by saying that her works are the faithful portrayal of her times. In his scholarly lecture he made references to British Literature, American Literature and Indian Literature.

Prof. V. Richard, Former Professor and Head, Department of English, St. Joseph's College, Trichy, delivered the keynote address and highlighted the 'Need for Revolution in Humanities'. He started his speech with the quotation 'A thing of beauty is a joy forever'. He spoke about the present condition of youth and their mentality on spirituality and religion. He explained the greatness of the works of Wordsworth, Keats and Shelley and their everlasting nature. He mentioned that all must be familiar with more than one literature. He added that an idea of Greek and Latin literatures will be useful to have a better perspective of English literature. He spoke about the utilities and futilities of studying humanities. Finally, he concluded that, younger generation must equip themselves with the habit of reading and also must learn about current issues by reading good newspapers and magazines. The programme ended successfully with a vote of thanks proposed by Dr. M. Natarajan, Assistant Professor, Dept. of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa University, Karaikudi.

National Conference on World Poetry: Ancient and Modern



A National Conference on World Poetry: Ancient and Modern was held at Alagappa University, Karaikudi on 21.3.2016 in connection with World Poetry Day celebrations. Dr.PMadhan, Associate Professor, Department of English and Foreign Languages, welcomed the gathering and presented the thematic address. In his presentation Dr. Madhan traced the evolution of British poetry from Chaucer down to the modernist poetry of the 20th century. He referred to various movements in English poetry and pointed out briefly the significant features of these movements. Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, highlighted the importance of experience, imagination, creativity and inspiration to write good poetry. "A poem, he said, has to fulfill the aesthetic needs of a reader." He quoted from the new poets to illustrate his views. He added how the Imagist Movement and the remarkable contribution of Ezra Pound helped to create a new trend in world poetry paving the way for the emergence of New Poetry in almost all languages of the world. Dr. S. Thangasamy, Vice-Chancellor, Tamilnadu Teacher Education University, Chennai, inaugurated the seminar and dwelt at length on how imagism has taken deep roots in modern poetry and especially in New Poetry. Supporting the dictum "Art for life's sake" he said that a poem should have a message; and modern poetry has recorded social injustice powerfully in a language that is simple and he quoted purple passages from a few poems to explain this. He exhorted the students to pen poems and sometimes they may become popular and eternal. He concluded his speech by saying that "Pen is mightier than sword" and asked the participants to bear this in mind always.

Dr. P. Maruthanayakam, Fellow, Central Institute of Classical Tamil, Chennai, in his keynote address, referred to the significant role of poets in a society. He made a reference to a common fear expressed

throughout the world whether poetry has a future at all. If it has a future then what will be its role. He dwelt at length on the "Agam Tradition" in Tamil poetry. He said that the ancient Tamils have developed the language by consciously using the poetic medium and thereby they have enriched the language. He eulogized the ancient Tamil grammarians for evolving a remarkable Tamil poetics. By making a comparison between Tamil and English "comparison markers", he pointed to the genius of Tamil Grammarians. He illustrated some of the interesting poetic devices used by ancient and modern poets. He concluded his speech by referring to the broad perspective of Tamil poets and their worldview. He added that they have always viewed the world and, the humanity as one and quoted Vallalar's soul-fulfilling verse in this connection. Dr.M.Natarajan, Assistant Professor, Department of English and Foreign Languages, proposed a vote of thanks.

A book entitled Honey Drops of Literature containing the best research papers was released by Dr. Marudanayakam and the first copy was received by Dr.Thangasamy. A literary research journal Roots was released by Dr. Thangasamy and the first copy was received by Prof.S.Subbiah. Nearly hundred papers were presented and four hundred scholars attended the seminar.

Eight experts attended the programme. The valediction function was presided over by Kavingar Thangam Moorthy, a former member of the Sahitya Akademi, Delhi. A famous Malayalam poet Sripathi Padmanabha and Dr. I.K. MeeraRao, an academic from Karnataka, delivered scintillating lectures at the valedictory session. Prizes were given to the winners in poetry competitions held both in Tamil and English. Dr. L. Thirunavukkarasu, Visiting Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

Prof. V.Balachandran, Registrar-in-charge, presided over the programme and said this kind of training programmes is extremely beneficial to the student community. Every year we produce more number of graduates but the labour market expects the graduates with good employability skills. Very few institutions alone provide employability skills to their students, for that reason alone they charge too much fees but in Alagappa University, we impart these employability skills with the support of the host institution. So he requested the beneficiaries to make the best use of this training programme.

Prof.A.Narayanamoorthy, Syndicate Member and Professor of Economics, inaugurated the training programme and said, "without employment no life". For peaceful and happy life one needs decent employment. Especially for youth, employment is very crucial. Young people are the pillars of a nation and the nation's progress depends on them.



According to 2011 census, youth constitute 40 % of the Indian population. So we have huge "young" human resource in our country. In India, on one side huge numbers of employment opportunities are available in institutions which seek suitable persons and on the other side lakhs and lakhs of people are waiting in the queue at the doorsteps of employment offices. Hence, these kinds of employability skills training programmes are essential and will help to provide suitable human resource to the current employment needs. He asked the beneficiaries to seize upon the opportunities to the maximum extent and do hard work. Getting proper training to focus on work will help them to lead a life of fulfillment, he added.

Prof. S.Rajaram, Coordinator, NSS, delivered the special address. He said this kind of programmes for developing employability skills would help the students to get jobs and prove their ability during their employment period.

Prof. K.R. Murugan, Professor of Women's Studies, said according to human index report we are ranked in the 132nd place among 177 world countries. Now engineers want to switchover their job interest from engineering to administration and social sciences. So students need to learn employability skills for their employment.

In the participants' feedback they said the five-day course helped them understand the need to enhance their employability skills and also the need to equip themselves according to job scenario. The training sessions were conducted in conformity with the training manual on youth employability developed by RGNIYD.

The Valedictory Function was held on 1st April, 2016 at the Department of Women's Studies. Prof. K. Manimekalai, Dean, Faculty of Arts, delivered the valedictory address; and in her speech she highlighted the need for and importance of youth employability training programmes. She also listed out the various useful programmes conducted by the Department of Women's Studies since its inception in 1986. She highlighted the recent trends in the job market. She said that on one side academic institutions produced more number of unemployable graduates and on the other side more number of job vacancies day by day. She concluded her speech with the words "If youngsters are not equipped with job skills in addition to their degrees, they will be marginalized in the employment market".

Prof. S.Rajamohan delivered the special address to the gathering. He highlighted how youth employability training is very important as far the student community is concerned. As a faculty of the Management Programme, he opined that by looking into the module of the RGNIYD and its efforts to design an effective curriculum, the RGNIYD deserved encomium. He also observed from the participants' feedback, how fruitful the five-day training on youth employability skills was. He made a plea to organize this kind of training programmes frequently for the benefit of the marginalized youth.

He said that this kind of training on employability skills to the youth of the marginalized sections such as Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes is really meaningful and an urgent need of the hour. In today's highly competitive job market the rural-based students find it tough to get employment. In the govt jobs the majority share is taken by the urban sector. In this context, imparting employability skills to the youth, is the only solution and he congratulated the planners on focussing this aspect. Mrs. Poulpunitha, Assistant Professor of Women's Studies, welcomed the gathering earlier and Dr.M.Velusamy, Assistant Professor of Social Work, Department of Women's Studies, delivered a vote of thanks.

Parents-Teachers Meet

The Department of Bioelectronics & Biosensors organized Parents- Teachers Meet on 30.01.2016. Almost all M.Sc. students were present with their parents. The meeting started with the welcome address given by the Head of the Department Prof. C. Sekar. He briefed about the departmental activities and the course. Dr. V. Dharuman, Assistant Professor, gave a power point presentation about the importance of Biosensors and its applications in the area of medicine, environment and food technology. He also elaborated on the scope of the study and the future opportunities for the students. Mrs. C. Sumathi spoke about the opportunities for higher studies and scholarships available especially for female students. The parents also interacted with the staff to share their opinions and they suggested that such meetings be arranged periodically, at least once in six months, so that they come to see the status of their wards. Some parents happily expressed that it was like a family get -together and the meeting ended with lunch.



Alumni Meet

The department had an Alumni Meet on the same day. Many old students attended the meeting and shared their experiences after acquiring M.Sc./PhD degrees from the Department. Some of them pointed out that "ours is a unique Department and that the courses offered are not familiar to many, including many in higher educational institutions." Hence students requested the authorities to arrange campus interviews periodically which may help the students to find jobs for such interdisciplinary courses. The alumni who are working/ pursuing higher studies abroad also interacted with the students through Skype and they offered to help the current students to find jobs/scholarships abroad. They also agreed to form an association and create fund to help the needy students of the Department.

Research Work

Diabetes is a serious chronic disease and it is more prevalent in India than in any other part of the world. Currently 62 million people suffer from diabetes in India, reported International Diabetes Federation (IDF) and it is estimated to increase over 100 million in 2030. One million people die each year due to this illness. Hence Govt. of India is undertaking several initiatives such as creating awareness and developing indigenous and cost effective equipments to combat this severe health problem. This disease is basically controllable by

changing the life style and regular monitoring of the sugar level of the diabetic person. For monitoring the blood sugar level, glucometer, a bioelectronic instrument, is being used. In the measuring device, the sensor component costs about Rs.25 to 30/-. A diabetic person has to spend a minimum of Rs. 50/- per day to check disease status and this leads to huge amount of money to be spent by a diabetic person. In order to reduce the cost further, Dr. Dharuman and his team in the Department of Bioelectronics and Biosensors, have developed sensor chips based of nanomaterials to reduce the cost of the sensor chip down to Rs. 5.0 to 7.0/-. This project is financially supported by Indian Council of Medical Research, New Delhi, with the total amount of Rs. 32.7 lakhs. The sensor is under investigation in laboratory conditions and soon technology will be transferred to ICMR, New Delhi, for further technology development.

DEPARTMENT OF BIOINFORMATICS



The Department of Bioinformatics organized the 8th National Seminar-cum- Workshop on Recent Trends in Structural Bioinformatics and Computer Aided Drug Design (SBCADD-2016) from 16th to 19th February 2016. Eminent scientists from various prestigious institutions delivered lectures on computation methods, which could play a major role in developing drugs for the human kind. More than 250 participants including students, research scholars and staff members across the country

participated in the seminar. Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, released the souvenir and said that approximately one third of the world's population (2 billion) is infected with Mycobacterium tuberculosis (Mtb), Cancer, Alzheimer disease; Chikunguniya, Dengue fever and Swine flu and the much hyped Zika virus – the oldest virus that has brought about alarming threats to the society and thus has emerged to seek attention among the scientific community .

Prof. K. Ramasamy, Vice-Chancellor, Tamil Nadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, said that the present generation could involve and make the best use of the natural products available from the Mother Nature that could provide a new avenue in Drug Discovery. In addition, he also said that Bioinformatics is becoming one of the best opportunistic fields in an application oriented aspect; and India should be the "UPLOADING COUNTRY" in the near future. Prof. T.P. Singh, Distinguished Biotechnology Research Professor, Department of Biophysics, All India Institute of Medical Science, New Delhi, in his keynote address emphasized that India has the second highest downloads of databases and the prospect of science in the country is bright. Bioinformatics being a knowledge based area seems to be a challenging one and will be highly competitive for the present generations and wished that there could be a society developed deliberately for Bioinformatics and Drug discovery.

Prof. N. Srinivasan, Molecular Biophysics Unit, Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore, in his special address urged that the students should rely on their instincts in analysis of biological data rather than relying on the software and tools used. Prof. D. Velmurugan, UGC-BSR Faculty, Former Head, CAS in Crystallography and Biophysics, University of Madras, Chennai, delivered the Felicitation Address and narrated the contributions of Structure based Drug Design in pharmaceutical

Climate change presents a challenge to agricultural production and food security. One third of global population is under water stress. It is estimated that half of our population would face water scarcity by 2030, with demand outstripping supply by 40%. Moreover, industries show priority in the maximization of their production rather than water efficiency and conservation. Adoption of modern technology and intelligent planning would certainly reduce the use of water and improve the quality of waste water. He believed that this and similar programs would certainly increase the awareness among the people about the importance and need for conservation of water.”

Dr.A.Narayanamoorthy, Professor of Economics and Member of the Syndicate of Alagappa University spoke about the need for conservation of water. He remarked that water is becoming a scarce commodity. Water theft is a serious issue today. Water is being taken out from agriculture sector to other sectors. Water stress index (WSI) is an indicator used all over the world. If the WSI is less than 1700 cubic meter per capita per annum, such area is identified as water scarce area. 70% of area in India is estimated to be acute water stress area. Moreover, water lots are increasing from corporate sectors. The solution for the water scarcity problems is in our hands only. We need to do a lot for supply and demand management. For this, we must save water by adopting micro-irrigation and such technologies.

Dr.B.J.Pandian, Professor, Tamilnadu Agricultural University, Coimbatore, highlighted that Tamilnadu has 6% of population, 4% of land area

and 2% water resources at national level. Whenever water resources become scarce, we think of it. Water leakage is very common in domestic and business areas. It should be set right. Growth of non-agricultural sector is increasing in a faster rate. In spite of 17 major river basins in Tamilnadu, we are moving to water stress situation. The resources are shrinking, and hence every citizen should know about the water resources in and around their place and concentrate on conservation aspects. Water market and water footprint are to be taught at grass-root level. Everybody should take a pledge to conserve water for sustainable growth. This event witnessed the participation of 300 scholars from various institutions from different parts of India. Dr. P. Mathematics is the Science of all Sciences and art of all arts. The Indian Mathematics teachers are lauded as human calculators. A good astrologer should really be good at Mathematics to calculate various “dasas”.

Dr. A. Narayanamoorthy, Professor and Head, Department of Economics and Rural Development, Alagappa University, in his felicitation address pointed out that the well-known Economists had deep knowledge in Mathematics and cited the example of remarkable economists such as Alfred Marshall and John Forbes Nash.

He narrated the contributions of Aurobindo, Rabindranath Tagore, Mahatma Gandhi and Swami Vivekananda for the cause of education and for the upliftment of humanity; and the Indian system of education extends value system to the students along with education.

Prof. Kazuhiko Watanabe, Hiroshima University, Japan, in his inaugural address narrated the policies and practices for sports activities developed by Japan for winning gold medals in Olympic Games. He felt that with the introduction of reforms in the insurance sector, customers are able to get wide variety of choices of various products. He opined that ICT has helped the insurance companies to cover millions of people. In his concluding remarks, he pointed out that the success of insurance companies depend upon their ability to introduce innovations from time to time.

Shri R.Pattabiraman, Deputy General Manager, Cholanmandalam General Insurance Co.Ltd, Chennai inaugurated the seminar. He explained the evolution of insurance industry and the nationalization of life and non-life insurance business in India. The main purpose of IRDA is to safeguard the interest of the policyholders. He said that the main purpose of insurance is to provide protection and social security to the insured public. He gave statistical data on how insurance companies have compensated huge losses suffered by various states during natural disasters in the recent past. In November 2015, a sum of

Rs.220 Crore is the amount of claim settled by his company to the victims of floods at Chennai. He added that three types of risks are given more thrust for insurance cover by the industry viz., terrorism risk, cyber crime risk and climate change. He concluded his speech by explaining the employment opportunities available to the students community as employees as well as intermediaries in the insurance industry.

In his thematic address, Dr.V.Manickavasagam, Dean, Faculty of Management emphasized the significance of life insurance for the common man. He opined that life insurance should be made compulsory for every one. He said that Indian insurance market has more potentials for growth as the insurance penetration is only 3% in India against the world average of 8%. He said that user friendly ICT facilities need to be strengthened in insurance industry.

Dr.R.Dhandapani, Syndicate member, in his felicitation address explained that there is more scope for insurance business in India as the population of younger generation is more than 50%. He made an appeal to the insurance industry to develop cost-effective products in the health insurance segment.

Dr.M.Selvam, Chairperson School of Management narrated the investment scenario in India and expected the insurance companies to be very cautious while making investments in stock markets.

Earlier, Dr.G.Jayabal, Professor and Head, Department of Bank Management welcomed the gathering and Dr.G.Parimalarani, Organising Secretary of the Seminar proposed a Vote of thanks.

In the first technical session on Marketing Challenges in the Indian Insurance Sector,

Dr.K.Alamelu, Professor, Department of Bank Management chaired the session. After introducing the chief guest she explained the concept of Marketing Challenges and raised the question for discussion regarding how to prevent the misselling of insurance products.
