From the Vice-Chancellor

The current issue of Azhagu in your hands speaks of a spectrum of events that happened in the campus during the month of October 2016. Of these, the 29th Convocation held on 13th October, the National Conference on Educational Practices in Chola Kingdom (850 – 1279 A.D.) and the International Conference on Tamil Culture are the three momentous occasions to be cherished forever by the academic community.

The eminent space scientist and currently the President of the Association of the Indian Universities Prof. D.S. Chauhan, in his Convocation Address, observed that convocations are not rituals but milestones in the career graph of the universities and they record the accomplishments but at the same time, he added, they remind the stakeholders, administrators and academics of the universities of their onerous responsibilities towards contributing to the knowledge economy in this era of far reaching changes. He said that India is heading towards new horizons of higher education and in this context, he suggested the tenure of potential staff holding higher positions in universities can be extended even after their superannuation, as they can take the higher educational institutions to lofty heights with their rich potential, vast knowledge and varied experience.

The International Conference on Tamil Culture provided an environment for confluence of ideas for the scholars from various countries. Looking at the Tamil Culture from multi-dimensional perspective, all of them agreed on the inherent strength of Tamil tradition and its unique features that have withstood by their inner merits all onslaughts from various other cultures, especially European. The deliberations at the National Seminar on Educational Practices in Chola Kingdom brought to the fore the nuances of an efficient educational system that flourished under the Chola Dynasty from 850 to 1279 A.D. Inscriptions are the standing monuments that proclaim to the world the genius of the administrators who used temples as educational hubs. The efficient administration of the Chola Period owed its success to the effective education system that was in vogue in those times.

The U.N.O.-advocated organizations of functions at the University to create awareness among the youth deserve mention. The invited expert speakers expressed serious concern over the changing natural phenomena in the world owing to man's indifference; and they highlighted the need to create knowledge to deal with challenges faced by the world in terms of climatic change, water scarcity and food security. It becomes the bounden duty and responsibility of everyone in the academia to take the torch of knowledge to common man engulfed in darkness in India, who needs to be educated on these aspects. Besides, every educated youth should set an example by practice rather than by precept and that will enthuse the illiterate people to emulate the example of the educated youth and make them walk on the road to nation's progress.

29TH CONVOCATION OF ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY



The 29th Convocation of Alagappa University was held in the University Convocation Hall on Thursday, the 13th of October 2016. Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu and Chancellor of Alagappa University Thiru CH. Vidyasagar Rao presided over the function and gave away the degrees to the new graduates.



Hon'ble Minister for Higher Education, Government of Tamil Nadu and Pro-Chancellor of Alagappa University Thiru K. P. Anbalagan graced the occasion and offered felicitations. In his felicitation address, he paid tribute to the Founder Alagappar for his selfless service to the cause of education. Eulogising the contribution of the Chief Minister of Tamil Nadu Ms. J. Jayalalithaa to higher education, he said that she gave importance to "Access, Equity, Quality and Employability". With this in view, skill development training and soft skill training are given prime importance in Tamil Nadu. He stated that "Tamil Nadu is leading in Gross Enrollment Ratio. The Indian average ratio is 23.6%,

while the average in Tamil Nadu is 44.8%". He said Women's Education is given great importance in Tamil Nadu and it is indicated by the Gross Enrollment Ratio of 42.7% in Tamil Nadu, while the Indian average is 22.7%. He added that he was happy to note that 74% of the students are women in Alagappa University.

The Minister said that there are 58 universities and 2470 colleges in Tamil Nadu today and during the last 5 years the Government headed by Ms. J. Jayalalithaa started 67 colleges. The Government is always conscious of Periyar EVR's golden words "if you educate a woman, you are educating a society". As per the MHRD survey of 2014-15, the Tamil Nadu is placed in the first place in offering higher education to women. By providing employment to 15.95 lakhs of youth, Tamil Nadu is in the forefront, as per Annual Survey of Industries. Of the 25 top ranking institutions of higher learning in India, once again Tamil Nadu is in the lead position. He exhorted the students to lead an ethical life as exemplified by Thiruvalluvar in Thirukkural. He also asked them to develop the positive ideal "we can do, we can, we will".



Prof. D. S. Chauhan, Vice-Chancellor, GLA University, Mathura (U.P.) and President, Association of Indian Universities, New Delhi, in his Convocation Address, observed that convocations are milestones and they recognize accomplishments but at the same time points to the future responsibility

of the universities in contributing to the knowledge economy. He added that our country is facing climate changes and is confronting environmental issues on the one hand and on the other it also faces challenges regarding the creation of an efficient teaching and learning environment. In this context, he exhorted the present generation of teachers and students to ponder over these issues seriously and find solutions to solve them. He told the youth "Rather ask yourself what you can do to your country that none has done till today" and asked them to resolve accomplishing greater tasks. "The young generation must learn that unless 'your knowledge' is utilized either by the nation or by you, nothing could be achieved".

Striking a positive note, he said the world has become "small" owing to technological advancements in the field of communication and developments in other fields. He added, "Opportunities are far greater today; and today's graduates have wider choices that were not available for earlier generations. India has specific importance in the world today because of its large youth population. "A young country and you, as young fresh graduates and P.G.s and Ph.Ds in different disciplines, will be joining a dynamic, competitive, productive, youthful workforce". He advised the youth to take upon themselves the responsibility of leadership and lead the country to progress and prosperity. Highly educated leadership in all sectors and domains will be required to maintain higher economic growth. He added that according to an ILO Report, there will be a 32% increase of Indian workforce in the next four years. He suggested that the tenure of potential staff holding higher posts in universities can be extended even after their superannuation as they can take the higher education institutions to a better level. He lauded the Founder of this University Dr. Alagappa Chettiar for his munificence, magnanimity and philanthropy.

Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his Welcome Address, recounted the activities and programmes of the University. He said that the vision of the University is to achieve excellence in all spheres of education. He mentioned that 9 departments have been started; and 2 Centres have been upgraded into two full-fledged departments; during the academic year 2016-17, 30 programmes of study under the University Departments and 21 new programmes of study under the Distance Education mode have also been initiated. He stated that all together 1, 31,000 students are pursuing higher studies in the university, affiliated colleges and distance education stream. A Yoga Centre and a University Scientific Instrumentation Centre are additions made recently. He made references to MoUs signed with Universities abroad, as well as at home, the visit of distinguished scholars from abroad to Alagappa University and visits of our faculty members to various universities abroad and also referred to the grant of Rs.7 crores sanctioned by DST, New Delhi, under the Promotion of University Research and Scientific Excellence (PURSE) Scheme. He expressed his gratitude to all the funding agencies both the Central and State Governments.

1,073 regular students from the University Departments and Constituent Colleges, 10,091 students from the Affiliated Colleges, 608 students from the Collaborative Programmes and 19,447 students from the Distance Education stream received their degrees during this convocation. In total, 31,219 students were conferred with the degrees, of which 11,736 graduates were men while 19,483 were women.

In this convocation, 229 candidates consisting of 117 Ph.D. research scholars, 29 M.Phil. Rank holders from the University Departments and Affiliated Colleges, 72 Post -Graduate and Under-Graduate students from the University Departments and Affiliated Colleges and 11 students from

Collaborative Programmes received their degrees in person.

Moreover, 28 gold medalists, 7 M.Phil.students from the University Departments, 20 Post-Graduate students from the University Departments, 1 Under - Graduate student from Affiliated College received their Gold Medals from the Hon'ble Governor of Tamil Nadu.

CENTRE FOR TAMIL CULTURE

International Conference on "Tamil Culture – A Multi-dimensional Perspective"



The Inaugural function of the Two-day International Conference on "Tamil Culture – A Multi-dimensional Perspective" organized by the Centre for Tamil Culture, Alagappa University, Karaikudi, was held at the L.CT.L. Palaniappa Chettiar Memorial Auditorium on 22.10.2016.

The main objective of the conference was to nurture, preserve and propagate rich Tamil tradition and culture and to discuss varied aspects of Tamil culture from different perspectives.

Presiding over the function, Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, said that this International Conference is the first of its kind to be organized by Alagappa University under the auspices of the recently - started Centre for Tamil Culture. Oneness of thoughts, words and deeds go to the making of a great culture. He added that culture is, indeed, the soul of any civilization. Today nations struggle to safeguard their tradition and



culture. The name and fame of a nation rests on the protection of its own culture and tradition. Indian culture has always been praised for its inherent strength all over the world since times of yore, and Tamil culture which is a part of this tradition has unique features and it has withstood all onslaughts from various other cultures especially the European by its inner merits. Tamil is considered as a cultural language as it is rich in literature and art and it also shows the righteous ways of leading a useful and fruitful life.

Further, the Vice-Chancellor said that the aim of education is to transfer our culture and tradition from one generation to another and educational institutions should work towards this objective. Alagappa University's Centre for Tamil Culture has been initiated with this noble idea. Efforts are already begun to establish a museum in this regard, he added.

Prof. Mugilai Rajapandiyan, Registrar, Central Institute of Classical Tamil, Chennai, in his special address, pointed out that Tamil is known not only for its antiquity but also for its simplicity and sweetness. He said that in an American University the wise saying of the Tamil Poet Avvaiyar "what is already learnt is a handful only but what is yet to be learnt is as vast as the world" adorns the main entrance of the institution. Because of its advocacy of a broad perspective and a world-view Thirukkural is certainly an international classic, he added. The greatness of Tamil culture is known throughout the world.

The Former Vice-Chancellor of Gandigram Rural Institute and current Syndicate Member of Alagappa University Prof. SM. Ramasamy, in his felicitation address, referred to the scientific ideas and thoughts found in ancient Tamil literature and said that it showed the genius of the Tamil race. Tamil literature has to be studied not simply for its literary merit but it has to be studied deeply for its other multifarious aspects that are dealt with by the great minds.

Prof. J. P. Prasanth Moro from France, in his felicitation address, stated that the Indian festivals like Pongal, Deepavali and Vinayagar Chaturthi are celebrated enthusiastically by the Tamils living in France. Some of the educational institutions in France are offering Tamil studies and also they provide facilities for Tamil research. The Thiruvalluvar statue has been erected at the entrance to the world famous School of Oriental Studies in London and the speaker indicated how the world revered a great literary genius like Thiruvalluvar. That the two lakh Tamils living in France would protect the Tamil culture and tradition, he hoped.

Prof. M. Krishnan from Malaya University, Kuala Lumpur, in his address, explained how the Tamils in Malaysia were able to protect the Tamil culture for nearly 200 years from the impact of Chinese, Malay and European cultures. He added that Tamil schools in Malaysia are doing good work and some universities offer opportunities for studying Tamil at higher level. He congratulated the authorities of Alagappa University for starting a Centre for Tamil Culture which would be a boon for posterity to preserve and propagate Tamil culture.

Dr. Shanthi Kesavan, Head, Department of Hindu Civilization, Eastern University, Sri Lanka, said that in spite of several hardships the Sri Lankan Tamils could protect Tamil culture and tradition. For them the language and culture are the most significant ones and they are endeavouring to preserve them.

Dr. A. Arivu Nambi, Pondicherry University and Dr. Aranga Paari, Annamalai University, Dr. K. Manimekalai, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Alagappa University, also offered their felicitations at this function. A three volume work containing research articles was released by Dr. Mugilai Rajapandiyan and copies were received by the distinguished guests.

Dr. K. Gurunathan, Member of the Syndicate, Professors, Research Scholars and Students from the University Departments and Colleges participated in the programme. Dr. V. Balachandran, Registrar i/c, welcomed the gathering. Dr. K. Senthamizh Pavai, Director, Centre for Tamil Culture, proposed a vote of thanks.

On 22nd Oct 2016 evening a gala cultural event was organised in which students from the Department of Fine Arts and Affiliated Colleges performed folk dances such as Karagattam, Mayilattam, Oyilattam, Puliattam, Silambattam, Kolattam and Mankombattam. It was a sight to dream of to watch the youngsters perform varied traditional dances which intrinsically reflected the uniqueness of ancient Tamil Culture.



The Valedictory Function was organised on the afternoon of 23rd October, 2016 at the University Seminar Hall. Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, presiding over the function stressed the predominant role of tradition in changing a common man into a man of culture. Tamil culture with its inherent strength has all the

finer nuances to transform a person into a noble and gentle personality. We can see the essence of culture in the entire corpus of Tamil Literature. The main characteristic of Tamil Culture is to treat everyone alike with respect and to esteem all equally irrespective of all differences. If mind excels, our intention excels, if intention excels our deeds also become worthy of emulation. If our deeds become noble our life will surely become worthy. So living with a mind of purity is a way of ethical living that will usher in success. He also added that a separate museum is being established near the Alagappar Museum to showcase the antique Tamil cultural treasures collected by the Centre.



Thavathiru Kundrakudi Ponnambala Adigalar in his oration highlighted the uniqueness of Tamil language that offers a code of conduct to lead a glorious and useful life, dividing it broadly into Agam (Life Interior or personal life) and Puram (Life Exterior or social life). Love and friendship are cherished a treasure in our culture as very essential factors for making life a delightful one. Tamil culture says 'having good friends will enhance one's life' because love and brotherhood are the foundation upon which Tamil Culture is built. He also expressed his views on education and stated that the effect of education should not be evaluated on the basis of marks but should be assessed on values inherited by the educated. He said that it is in the hands of the youth to preserve Tamil culture for the emulation of posterity. He exhorted them to give a prime place to Thirukkural in their life style.

Prof. S. Sachchithanandham from France delivered the felicitation address. Prof. M. Krishnan from Malaysia participated in this function. Prof. C. Sundaresan, Tamil University, Thanjavur and Prof. M. Chidambram, Alagappa Govt. Arts College, Karaikudi, presented a review of the conference.

Prof. V. Balachandran, Registrar, Prof. S. Senthamizhpavai, Director, Centre for Tamil Culture, Alagappa University, Professors and delegates from various universities and colleges, research scholars and students and distinguished guests from Karaikudi participated in the function. Prof. V. Thiruveni delivered the welcome address and Asst. Prof K. Kananadhan proposed a vote of thanks.

Special Lecture on Shakespearean plays



Department of English and Foreign Languages organized a special lecture programme on 21.10.2016 with Dr. V. Nagarajan, Associate Professor and Head, Department of English, Alagappa Govt. Arts College, Karaikudi as resource person. Dr. P. Madhan, Head i/c of the Department, delivered the welcome address. The resource person gave a comprehensive lecture on Shakespearean plays particularly his He said that Shakespeare's literary works have transcended time and place, adding that his dramas are not for an age but for all ages, not for one country but for all countries, not for one generation but for all generations. He further illustrated that the reason for the popularity and timelessness of Shakespearean plays are that they are accurate and realistic expression of

human life with all its dimensions. Dr. V. Nagarajan stated that no university across the globe has left out Shakespearean plays in the syllabus. It bears testimony to the greatness of Shakespearean plays. Then the distinguished speaker made elaborate references to Shakespeare's tragedies Macbeth, Hamlet, Othello and King Lear. pointed out that tragic flaws of protagonists lead to their down fall. Macbeth's overvaulting ambition, Othello's suspicion, Hamlet's procrastination and King Lear's misjudgement resulted in their defeats. The chief guest also said that Shakespeare was not in favour of mingling of comedies and tragedies. Dr. V. Nagarajan further elaborated that the timeless dramatist's plays are so profound and deep that they make an everlasting impact on the audience. In addition to 37 plays, the chief guest said, the playwright composed 154 sonnets as well. The perusal of Shakespearean plays would provide both knowledge and delight for the readers, he pointed out. He exhorted the students to read the original texts of Shakespeare to derive maximum pleasure and benefit from his writings. In the end, Dr. M. Natarajan proposed a vote of thanks.

National Seminar on "Educational Practices in Chola Kingdom (850 - 1279 A.D.)

EPICK-2016"



The inaugural function of a Two-day National Seminar on "Educational Practices in Chola Kingdom (850 ~ 1279 A.D.) EPICK~2016" was held at Alagappa University on 6.10.2016. The Seminar was organized by the Department of History and the Directorate of Distance Education of Alagappa University, Karaikudi, under the sponsorship of Indian Council of Historical Research, New Delhi.

Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his Presidential Address, stated that an efficient educational system flourished under the Chola dynasty. He added that an in-depth study of the system will help the scholars to compare the present system of education prevailing in India with that of the ancient and traditional system of

education nurtured at the Chola Kingdom. From the Chola inscriptions, we understand how education was given prime importance at the village level; and there are many references to Village Educational Committees, governed by Council Members, who mobilized funds from the village for imparting education to children; and education in fact, included art and culture.

Temples during the Chola period acted effectively as places of education. The system of education followed during that period was commended by historians. The temples built by the Chola kings abound in inscriptions that reveal that the temples acted as educational hubs and according to an inscription found in Thiruvallam, nearly 7000 students were living and studying under one roof and it bears testimony to the efficient administration of the Kingdom owing to importance given to education.

Dr. N. Rajendran, Professor and Head, Department of History, Bharathidasan University, Tiruchirappalli, in his Keynote Address, had a word of praise for Chola Kings for their understanding of universalization of education, which is being given due emphasis by modern educational planners throughout the world. Referring to the historical sense, he said that history is inferenceoriented and history students should be made to comprehend this important aspect, while studying history. Among the old civilizations of the world, only Indian and Chinese civilizations had started the writing of history. In the total number of historical evidences available through inscriptions, one-third is available in Tamil Nadu and a maximum number of inscriptions relate to the Chola Dynasty.

The great chronicler Vincent Smith has used the word "the great" for two Indian emperors -- Asoka and Akbar. In a similar fashion, Prof. Neelakanta Shastri, has given this adage to the Chola emperor Raja Raja Cholan (Raja Raja the great). He said that the Chola Kingdom excelled in international



trade and commerce and civil engineering skill that could be inferred from inscriptions and could be seen from dams and temples built by them and it indicates the multi-disciplinary educational system that was prevalent during their regime. He added that efficient educational system led to efficient administration during the Chola period.

Prof. V. Vaithiyanathan, Retd. Professor of History, H.H. The Rajah's College, Pudukkottai, was honoured with a citation that praised him as "an icon of altruism". Prof. A. Narayanamoorthy, Member of Syndicate, and Prof. K. Manimekalai, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Alagappa University, offered their felicitations. A voluminous seminar souvenir was released on the occasion. More than 200 scholars participated in the seminar.

Earlier, Dr. K. Krishnamoorthy, Head i/c, Department of History and Organizing Secretary of the Seminar, welcomed the gathering and Dr. AR. Saravanakumar, Associate Professor, D.D.E, and Convener, proposed a vote of thanks.

Special Lecture Programme



The Department of History arranged a Special Lecture programme on 21.10.2016 with Prof J. B. More, Institute for Research in Social Sciences and Humanities, Paris, as resource person.

Prof. V. Balachandran, Registrar i/c, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, observed that the History Department though in an infant stage had ventured to conduct a National Seminar recently. He added that the seminar helped the students to learn about the recent trends in research in the field of history.

Prof. K. Manimekalai, former Vice-Chancellor of Mother Teresa University, Kodaikkanal and currently Dean, Faculty of Arts, Alagappa University, offered felicitations. She laid stress on the role of research for the upliftment of the society.

Prof. J. B. More, an eminent scholar from Institute for Research in Social Sciences and Humanities, Paris, France, delivered the Special Lecture. In his scintillating lecture he explained in detail about the recent trends in Historical Research and stressed the thrust areas to be identified by scholars; and the speaker asked the scholars to involve themselves earnestly in research activities. He added that historical research must revolve around societal needs and hence researchers must be guided without bias. Researchers must make use of Information Communication Technology to the fullest extent. This type of research skills will help them in bringing out the new innovative thoughts and knowledge in the discipline.

Dr. K. Krishnamoorthy, Assistant Professor and HOD i/c, Department of History, delivered the welcome address. Dr. G. Paranthaman, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

An interactive session was organised in the afternoon in which participants from the Department of History, Alagappa Government Arts College, P.G Students, and M.Phil. Scholars from the University

Department enthusiastically involved themselves in a lively discussion with the distinguished guest. The University faculty members -- Dr. V. Thiruveni, Dr. Vasumalai Raja, GP. Raja, Dr. A. Senthilrajan, Teaching Assistants Dr. K. Kilimozhi, Mrs. Santhi and faculty from Alagappa Govt Arts College Mr. Gunasekaran and Dr.Nilober Begam – took part in the discussion.

World Food Day Celebrations



On the eve of World Food Day Celebrations 2016, a Seminar on the theme "Climate is Changing. Food and Agriculture Must Too" was organized by the Department of Economics and Rural Development of Alagappa University, Karaikudi, on 21.10.2016 at the Seminar Hall of the Convocation Auditorium.

Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, in his presidential address, said that climate change is a major and growing threat to global food security. He regretted that human beings disturb Nature and Nature wreaks vengeance on them. He added that South Koreans after studying climate changes seriously, plan and cultivate crops accordingly. He said that the FAO in its latest report titled "The State of Food and Agriculture (2016)" has emphasized that climate change has already begun to affect the world's food production and unless significant action is taken, it could put millions at risk of hunger and poverty in the next few decades. The report points out that under severe

climate change scenario, about 122 million more people could be living in extreme poverty by the year 2030 compared to a future with no climate change, he added.

In the past few years, India has seen an unprecedented increase in the frequency and intensity of extreme weather events. For nearly 60 years, the monsoon rainfall has been declining and variability has increased. A report of the World Bank warned that by 2040s, India would see a significant reduction in crop yields because of extreme heat. It is estimated that by the 2050s, with a temperature increase of 2 degree Celsius to 2.5 degree Celsius, water for agriculture production in the river basins of the Indus, the Ganges, and the Brahmaputra will shrink further and may impact food adequacy for about 63 million people. In this context, he said that we should be conscious of this serious problem and should plan things for future agriculture and food security.

Dr. L. Venkatachalam, Professor, Madras Institute of Development Studies, Chennai, in his Keynote Address, said that the last year's unprecedented rains in Chennai and the havoc caused by it was owing to climate changes and man's indifference to Nature. In the past, farmers in India were able to predict climate changes and planned for cultivation of crops accordingly and today, they are not able to predict anything about monsoon and it has led to the deterioration in agriculture and consequently it has affected food production. He added that the most vulnerable population included agriculturists in developing countries whose livelihood depend on farming. Global declines in production may result in higher food prices, placing a greater strain on already vulnerable low-income communities. As majority of the Indian people rely on agriculture for their livelihood, a serious concern should be shown to strengthen the agricultural sector. He added that preserving and saving water becomes imperative to save millions of people from hunger and poverty

in future. He regretted that one-third of the food quantity is wasted and an awareness should be created among the people regarding this.

Dr. A. Narayanamoorthy, Professor and Head, Department of Economics and Rural Development welcomed the gathering. Dr. B. Dharmalingam, Director, Alagappa Institute of Skill Development Centre, proposed a vote of thanks. Faculty Members, Research Scholars and Students from the University Departments attended the programme. 40 Research Papers were presented by the students and scholars.

National Conference on "Swami Vivekanandar: A Youth Icon"

Dr. S. Sachchithanantham, Institute International des Etudes Superieures, Paris, France, in his inaugural address, pointed out Swami Vivekananda was described as the 'Hindu Storm' by American magazines during his historic Chicago visit. Fire and Safety Awareness Programme



The Directorate of Collaborative Programmes, Alagappa University, in association with National Service Scheme organized a "Fire & Safety Awareness Camp" on 19th October, 2016. The programme was conducted at different premises of the University.

Vice-Chancellor Prof. S. Subbiah, in his inaugural speech, referred to the exponential rise of fire related dangers/hazards that could be faced by mankind concomitantly with the advancement of science and in these circumstances, he added, it becomes imperative to acquire knowledge of protecting themselves and others better from the resulting calamities. He also added that we need to learn Disaster Management to escape from unexpected Natural calamities. He appealed to the students to create an awareness of the same that

could reach the under privileged/illiterate people and elders. In addition, he also expressed that this programme provided a platform for students to learn to be ready to handle any fire related calamitous situation.

Prof. J. Jeyakanthan, Director of Collaborative Programmes and the Organizer of Fire & Safety Awareness Camp, in his Welcome Address, laid emphasis on protecting oneself from unavoidable hazards caused due to fire and resulting smoke. Moreover, he asked the students to take necessary safety measures at accident prone areas irrespective of places -- be it Home, Industry or Workplace. Fire outbreak caused from electricity happens often and one should learn to handle fire-extinguisher at the time of emergency. Further, he said that one should not lose composure at the time of havoc and provide first-aid to fire accident victims.



The main aim of this programme is to enlighten the participants about precautionary measures to be taken and also steps to be taken at the time of fire-accidents. Tutors and experts from the IIPHS Fire & Safety Management College, S. Melur, Pudukottai District, demonstrated different kinds of fire accidents and showed specific and varied extinguishing methods to control fire.

STUDENTS' WELFARE MEASURE

As a part of Students' Welfare Measure and Healthy Practices, the Syndicate of Alagappa University, Karaikudi, decided to provide free education to meritorious students hailing from rural and poor families from the academic year 2016-17 onwards.

According to the norms prescribed to get free education at the University Departments and Constituent Colleges, the students joining the Under-Graduate courses should have obtained not less than 60% in their +2 examination and the students joining the Post-Graduate courses should have obtained 60% in Part III of their Degree Examination.

Further, they are required to submit income certificate duly issued by the Revenue Authorities. The fee waiver is considered for a single student in a class with a student strength of not less than 10. When the strength is more than 50 in a class, two students shall be considered for fee waiver.

Of the students admitted to the various UG and PG courses during the academic year 2016-17, forty two of them were found eligible by the Departmental

Committees constituted for the purpose and the amount they paid as fee at the time of admission to the courses were refunded fully by means of individual cheques by Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University at his chamber, in the presence of Dr. V. Balachandran, Registrar i/c. and the Syndicate Members of Alagappa University.

On account of this fee waiver scheme, the University incurred an expenditure of Rs.4,06,500/-. This is the first time that the University has extended this full fee waiver scheme for the benefit of the students hailing from economically downtrodden families.
