The newsletter has given a brief profile of the 11th Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Prof. G. Ravi who assumed office on 22.8.2022. A researcher par excellence and an outstanding academician, Prof. G. Ravi has joined the elite and eminent Chief Executives of Alagappa University. With his bonhomie, pleasing manners and disciplined approach, he has earned the goodwill of the entire academic and administrative fraternity on the campus, interestingly his home pitch, during his unblemished service in the last two and a half decades. He commenced his work on the very first day of his assumption of office as the Vice-Chancellor stating that he would endeavour hard to get maximum score in the fourth cycle of NAAC accreditation due in 2024.

The University securing the 28th place in NIRF Ranking - 2022 among the "universities category" at the national level, getting the 122nd position in Times Higher Education Asia Ranking 2022 and RUSA Star Award for Optimum Utilization of Resources are some of the laurels which the University has won recently. Celebrations of Teachers' Day, 76th Independence Day and International Yoga Day took place on a grand scale on the campus besides a number of seminars, webinars, conferences, special lectures and other programmes that were organized by various Departments of Study.

Prof. G. RAVI - A PROFILE

Dr. G. Ravi, who has assumed office as the eleventh Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, holds a high academic profile with 27 years of teaching and research experience in higher education. He hails from a progressive agriculturist's family rooted in culture. Born in the year 1965, he had his school education in Sirkali. As a consistently meritorious student, he obtained his P.G. and Doctoral Degrees from the Bharathidasan and Anna Universities respectively. He has done Post Doctoral Research at the world renowned Materials Science

Laboratory - NIMS, Japan under the most prestigious JSPS Award. He joined Alagappa University in February 1995 as Lecturer in Physics and by dint of hard work and impactful research, he has risen to the top executive position at the University. He holds a D.Sc., degree in Physics obtained from Alagappa University.

He has served as Dean, Industry and Consultancy; Chairperson School of Physical Sciences; Head, Department of Physics; Director, Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) and Chairman of various academic boards at the University. He has published so far around 400 quality research papers in Scopus Indexed, International and National Journals with an average impact factor of 3.8. They have attracted the attention of researchers in the specialized field with 6842 citations and have brought a h-index of 40 and also i-10 index of 182. His research works have helped in devising instruments such as Electro Optical Modulators for Optical Communication, Optical Memories for Data Storage, Super Capacitors, Sensors and Solar Cells which are directly useful to the society. The credit of publishing 1/12th of the total number of publications of the University goes to him. He holds 8 patents. He has guided 25 scholars in their Ph.D. research and undergone leadership training under LEAP programme at the University of Hyderabad and Monash University, Australia.

He has won 22 prestigious awards including Young Scientist Award, JSPS Fellow Award, Visiting Professor and Honorary Guest Professor at Shizuoka University, Japan and Fellowships like FRSC, U.K. and FASCH. He received the Dr. A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Lifetime Achievement Award in 2021. He has visited 23 countries across all the continents for presenting research papers. So far, he has presented 363 research papers in International / National Conferences.

8 Major research projects worth Rs. 350 Lakhs were executed by him with the help of funding agencies like UGC, DST, AICTE, TNSCST etc. During his tenure as Head of the Department of Physics, MoUs were signed between the Department of Physics, Alagappa University and Stanford University, U.S.A.; Western Norway University, Norway; GRT, Singapore, to which students are being sent periodically for training.

Infrastructural facilities have been improved at the Department and many sophisticated instruments were procured and installed in the Department and these facilities are being extended to other institutions. About Rs.140 lakhs were received as consultancy charges. Owing to his constant encouragement, the staff of the Department have published 600 quality research papers and improved the department h-index from 28 to 67 in the last six years.

VICE-CHANCELLOR'S ADDRESS AT THE PRESS MEET ON 22.08.2022



After assuming office as the 11th Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Prof. G. Ravi told the press that he would strive for an all inclusive development of the University as envisioned by its Founder Vallal Alagappar. Concerted efforts would be taken to reinforce the government policy of strengthening skill-oriented programmes that would help in developing the specific employability skills of the students and thus meet the expectations of the employers. At the same time focus would be laid on socially relevant research at the higher level. He added that steps also would be taken to augment the financial resources for meeting increasing expenditure. Transparency in all activities will be the key factor in administration. Priority would be given to get maximum score (3.8 out of 4) in the fourth cycle of NAAC Accreditation to sustain the status of "grade one autonomous university". He concluded by saying that he would seek the co-operation of the faculty, administrative staff and students to achieve the planned progress and success in all endeavours.

The 113th Birth Anniversary of Vallal Alagappar was celebrated on a grand scale at Alagappa University, Karaikudi on 06.04.2022. The celebrations began with a memorial rally that started from Bhavnagar Stadium and ended at Vallal Alagappar Memorial Building. Floral



tributes were paid to the portrait of Vallal Alagappar by Dr. R. Swaminathan and Prof. S. Karuppuchamy, Members, VC Officiating Committee, Dr. C. Sekar, Registrar i/c, Dr. E. Kannapiran, Controller of Examinations i/c, Syndicate Members, Officials of the University, Teaching and Non Teaching Staff, Students, Alumni and Admirers of Alagappar at the Memorial Building.

Presiding over the function held later at L.CT. L. Palaniappa Chettiar Auditorium, Dr. R. Alagappar made his sleepy hometown Karaikudi as a hub of educational institutions benefiting all classes of people.

ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY SECURES 28TH POSITION IN NIRF RANKING - 2022

The Hon'ble Minister of Education Shri. Dharmendra Pradhan released the India Rankings 2022 for Higher Education Institutions during a function organized by the Ministry of Education (MoE) at New Delhi on 15.07.2022.

Alagappa University has secured the 28th position among the "Universities Category", 43rd position among the Research Institutions and 53rd position under the "Overall Category" among the 1875 higher educational institutions assessed at the national level for the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).

The University secured the 3rd place in "University Category" and "Research Institution Category" among the Universities that participated from Tamil Nadu.

The ranking framework evaluates institutions on five broad generic groups or parameters, i.e., Teaching, Learning and Resources, Research and Professional Practice, Graduation Outcome, Outreach and Inclusivity and Perception of the Public, Academics and Employers and also evaluates Research Papers in Journals and Citations.

Prof. J. Jeyakanthan, Director and his team members from Alagappa University Ranking Cell, collected, analyzed and submitted the data to NIRF, MoE, New Delhi for ranking.

It may be noted that Alagappa University has improved its ranking from 57th to 53rd position under Overall Institution Category and from 33rd to 28th rank under University Category.

ALAGAPPA UNIVERSITY GETS 122rd PLACE IN TIMES HIGHER EDUCATION (THE) ASIA RANKING - 2022

Alagappa University has secured 122nd Rank in Times Higher Education ASIA Rankings - 2022 released by the Times Higher Education (THE) on 01.06.2022. A total of 829 Institutions from Asia have secured different positions in Times Higher Education ASIA Universities Rankings - 2022. Alagappa University has secured the sixth place in the overall institutions ranked in India and the first place at the Tamil Nadu State level.

Under this THE world ranking, the performance of the participating institutions under five specific areas, viz. Teaching, Research, Knowledge Transfer, International Outlook and Industry Income, have been assessed and analyzed. However, the weightings are recalibrated to reflect the attributes of Asia's Institutions. "13 carefully calibrated performance indicators are used for providing

the most comprehensive and balanced comparisons, trusted by students, academics, university leaders, industry and governments", states the release.

Prof. J. Jeyakanthan, Director, Alagappa University Ranking Cell and his team members collected, analyzed and submitted the data to participate in THE World Ranking pertaining to the year 2021.

As part of the International Lecture Series, the Department of English and Foreign Languages conducted an International Webinar on 27.4.2022 with Prof. Dono Usmanova, Head of English Language Department, Fergana State University , Fergana, Uzbekistan as the resource person. Prof. P. Madhan, Head of the Department of English and Foreign Languages, delivered the welcome address.

Prof. Dono Usmanova, the guest of honour from Fergana State University, Uzbekistan spoke about post modernism. She called the school of postmodernism a counter-enlightenment movement which brought about unprecedented progress in all walks of human life. Prof. Dono Usmanova's articulation is that progress on this scale was made possible only by the faculty of reason and rationality. The phenomenon of enlightenment is a reason-powered movement but post-modernism does not believe in this reason-driven progress, Prof. Dono Usmanova added. Quoting Immanuel Kant who stated that the faculty of reason functions in specific ways in specific people and its findings are contingent and provisional, the guest of honour Prof. Dono Usmanova illustrated that postmodernism wants intuition-driven progress rather than reason-powered development. In addition to that, Prof. Dono vocalized the view that post modernism seeks to replace totalizing and over-arching meta narrative, by mini-narratives. The former is concerned with grand subjects like politics, religion, Marxism and so on whereas the latter deals with the way of life, culture, traditions and conventions of people who belong to the peripheries of society. The resource person described postmodernist fiction as historiography metafiction. Referring to Canadian postmodern critic Lynda Hutcheon, Prof. Dono Usmanova said that historiography is related to actual historical events and metafiction is pertaining to fictionality of fiction. It is a strange paradox. History contains the elements of fiction and fiction is seen as contributing to history, Prof. Dona Usmanova spelt out. She further put forth the notion that magical realism, pastiche, intertextuality, hyper-reality and pre-occcupation with extra-terrestial lives are some of the important post modern features.

At the end of the programme Dr. SP. Shanthi, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks. Faculty from University Departments, Affiliated Colleges, Research Scholars and PG students participated at the programme in great numbers.

International Webinar on T.S. Eliot, Identity and India

The Department of English and Foreign Languages organized an International level webinar on 16.06.2022. Prof. Robert Frazer, from Open University, Faculty of Arts Royal Holloway, University of London, participated as a guest of honour and delivered a lecture on the title "T.S. Eliot, Identity and India". In his lecture, he illustrated how the literary creations of T.S Eliot have turned out to be the documentation of socio, political, cultural and religious conditions of England in the wake of the two great World Wars. Prof. Robert Frazer called T.S. Eliot a versatile man of letters who stamped his individuality and creative personality in several literary genres including poetry, drama, prose, criticism and so on. The distinguished academic opined that T.S. Eliot's stature and standing are so great that he is known as the identity and face of twentieth century English literature. T.S. Eliot whom the resource person projected as a spiritualist bemoans the decline of ethics, deterioration of morals and break-down of public morality in "The Waste Land". T.S. Eliot's knowledge of Indian Vedas and Upanishads is so phenomenal that he presents a three-fold remedy of Datta, Dayatavam and Damyata taken from Upanishads for eliminating all the maladies of modern life, Prof. Robert Frazer added. Another significant idea which figured prominently in the discourse of Prof. Robert is that T.S Eliot is a modernist keen on creating order out of disorder, unity out of disunity and coherence out of incoherence. It is very much palpable that T.S Eliot was concerned about the overall progress of mankind, Prof. Robert Frazer explained. The English faculty of University department, affiliated colleges and other universities, research scholars and students participated at the webinar. At the end of the webinar, Dr. SP.Shanthi, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks.

Prof. Manikkam's exhortation to students is that they should draw inspiration from the character of Ulysses and make rapid strides in their career. They should always have a spark inside them to accomplish further in their career. He wound up the lecture by quoting the lines, "To strive, To seek and not to yield". When students put their heart and soul into the work they undertake, they will definitely become successful and victorious, Prof. Manikkam said.

Webinar on Shakespeare for All Ages

An International Webinar on Shakespeare for All Ages happened at the Department of English and Foreign Languages on 25.09.2022. Prof. Boothenia Majoul from University of Carthage, Tunisia took part in it as a guest of honour and made a talk on the above-mentioned topic.

Prof. P. Madhan, Professor and Head, Department of English and Foreign Languages, Alagappa University, delivered the welcome address.

Prof. Boothenia Majoul called Shakespeare a phenomenon whose thirty seven plays and hundred and forty four sonnets have attained immortality and deathlessness. She further added that Shakespeare's works are not for an age but for all ages not for one country but for all countries and not for one generation but for all generations. From her perspective, Shakespeare's plays are a repository of knowledge and a store-house of worldly wisdom. The Tunisian Professor Boothenia Majoul spelt out that Shakespeare's literary works remain a beacon light and guidance for human life. Apart from providing entertainment for the readers, the dramas of Shakespeare present enlightenment as well. Other ideas that appeared prominently in her lecture are as follows: Macbeth teaches that over-whelming ambition is an evil ii) Hamlet's lesson is how procrastination of action is dangerous iii) King Lear makes readers know blind-judgement of people is a flaw and Othello's weakness is that suspicion of loved ones is a huge defect. As part of her lecture, the speaker shed light on the ever-relevant and ever-applicable nature of Shakespeare's plays. Even if Shakespeare does not follow poetic justice in his plays, the very nature of humanlife - as the combination of joys and sorrows and ups and downs-justifies the absence of it, Professor Boothenia Majoul added.

At the end of the webinar, Dr. M. Natarajan, Assistant Professor, proposed a vote of thanks. English Faculty from University Department, Affiliated Colleges, Research Scholars and Students took part in the webinar.

Special Lecture on Fund Raising and Project Management

A Special Lecture on Fund Raising and Project Management was organized on 07th Sep 2022. Prof. K. Manimekalai, Head, Department of Women's Studies, in her welcome address, elaborated on the significance of the programme and highlighted some of the international and national agencies that provide funds for the development of nation. Further, she motivated the students to actively involve themselves in the activities carried out by various NGOs in and around their residing places. Dr.C. Joslin Thambi, Founder, BWDA Group of Institutions said that Bullock-Cart Workers Development Association (BWDA) was established on 2nd October, 1985 with the primary objective of rendering selfless, dedicated service for poverty alleviation and empowerment of bullock cart workers, unorganised labourers, rural artisans, poor and needy women and children in Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry and Andaman & Nicobar Islands. Their areas of work included health, water and sanitation, education, advocacy and lobbying, capacity building and livelihood development, child welfare, women's welfare, and social awareness.

He added that ensuring good education is essential for the proper growth of the younger generation; and they started BWDA Arts and Science College, BWDA Polytechnic College and BWDA Schools to address the disparity in accessing the educational facilities which help the marginalized for attaining intellectual prosperity. He also referred to various national and international funding agencies, method of availing funds, importance of auditing, significance of programme planning and steps in writing project proposal. He concluded his speech by

pointing out that the work done with involvement, commitment and enjoyment would definitely lead to success in life.

Dr. P. Sindhuja, Teaching Assistant, Department of Women's Studies, proposed a vote of thanks.

Special Lecture on Extension Approaches

The Department of Women's Studies organised a Special Lecture on Extension Approaches on 19th Sep 2022. Prof. K. Legal Literacy and Legal Awareness Programme



The Department of Women's Studies in collaboration with Karaikudi Taluk Legal Service Committee organized the Legal Literacy and Legal Awareness Programme on 22nd September 2022 at the Central Library Seminar Hall.

Dr. P. Veeramani, Assistant Professor, in her welcome address, highlighted the significance of the programme and asked the students and staff to disseminate the knowledge on various laws and acts that support and safeguard girls and women.

Prof. G. Ravi, Vice-Chancellor, in his presidential address, elaborated on the functions of Taluk Legal Service Committee and said that the main aim of the committee is to provide free and competent legal services to the weaker sections of the society, to promote justice on a basis of equal opportunity and to ensure that justice is not denied to any citizen by reason of their economic or other disabilities. He pointed out that promoting legal literacy would empower women and girls and help create a violence-free society. He also referred to legal principle that indicates "ignorance of the law is no excuse." which means that people cannot defend their actions by claiming they didn't know the law. Further, he mentioned that access to justice is a fundamental right guaranteed to all citizens by Article 14 and Article 21 of the Constitution of India. Denying a person in accessing justice deeply affects the quality of one's life.

Prof. S. Thanuskodi, Dean, Faculty of Arts, Alagappa University, in his keynote address, said that while India has enacted several acts for the welfare of the people only a few people approach the justice delivery system for redressal of their grievances. Majority of the people due to lack of awareness are victimized and hence to avoid such conditions the Taluk Legal Service Committee promotes awareness about the legal rights and various means and ways in accessing justice. Further, he elaborated on the significance and functions of Consumer Protection Act 1986, Human Rights Act 1993 and Right to Information Act, 2005.



Mr. A. Dharanidharan, Chairperson/District Munsif, Karaikudi in his special address highlighted that crimes against women in Tamil Nadu went up from 5,934 in 2019 to 6,630 in 2020, and 8,501 in 2021, as per NCRB data. These crimes include 'Cruelty by Husband or His Relatives', 'Assault on Women with Intent to Outrage Her Modesty', and 'Kidnapping & Abduction of Women', and 'Rape'. He referred to the years of sentences for violations such as outraging the modesty of women, sexual harassment, voyeurism and stalking.

Mr. V. Kannappan, Advocate, in his speech, said that in Tamil Nadu the Right to Information Act was enacted in 1997 but in India it was enacted in 2005. He highlighted that there are 31 sections in RTI 2005, and Sections 8,9,19, and 11 deal with disclosure of information. Further, he discussed the significance and importance of RTI 2005 act and exhorted the students to propagate the information they have gained through this programme to the people.

Mrs. S. Ratha, Advocate, Karaikudi discussed the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences Act, 2012, that protects children from offences like sexual assault, sexual harassment and pornography. She highlighted various sections that protect children and spoke about the methods of doing investigation as per POCSO Act, 2012.

Nearly 100 students and faculty members from various departments derived benefit from this programme. The vote of thanks was proposed by Dr. I. Sivakumar, Teaching Assistant.

Observance of National Nutrition Month 2022

To commemorate the National Nutrition Month" and "International Year of Millets", the Department of Women's Studies, organized a series of programmes from 28.08.2022 to 29.09.2022. Lecture series and competitions such as Seminar Presentation, Rangoli, Food Fest (Millet base), Comedy Skit, Debate, Nutri King and Queen were conducted by the Department.

Awareness Programme on Health Benefits of Millets

The International Year of Millets was also observed. The types millets and the importance of daily intake of millets were explained to the students and they were asked to disseminate the knowledge about the millets among neighbours, family members and friends. Nearly 80 students from various departments participated and benefited from the programme.

To create awareness about the millets a quiz competition was organised for University students on 17.10.2022 at the play ground of Faculty of Arts. 150 questions were asked in 10 rounds. Nearly 102 students actively participated and gained knowledge on health benefits of millets.

DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL WORK

World Suicide Prevention Week Observed

The World Suicide Prevention Week was observed by the Department of Social Work, Alagappa University, Karaikudi. This programme is being conducted throughout the world every year in September to raise awareness about the importance of taking suicide prevention measures and thereby improving the individual's mental health.



Presiding over the event held on 27.9.2022 at Alagappa University, Vice - Chancellor Prof. G. Ravi said: "According to WHO statistics, 7 lakh people commit suicide every year in the world. It has also mentioned that suicide is the fourth leading cause of death among youngsters aged between 15 and 29. In 2019, 77 percent of suicides occurred in low- and middle-income countries. Studies suggest a link between suicide and mental disorders in well- developed high- income countries. Suicide has been found to occur in times of crisis due to reduced ability to cope with stress created by financial problems, relationship breakdowns, chronic illness and pain. Suicide rates are high among people who experience discrimination, such as refugees and immigrants, homosexuals, transgender people, and prisoners. He added that according to a recent report published in "The Economic Times", Maharashtra accounted for the highest number of suicides in India as of 2021, followed by Tamil Nadu and Madhya Pradesh. A recent report by the National Crime Records Bureau states that career-related problems, loneliness, violence, family problems, mental disorders, alcoholism, financial loss and chronic illness and pain are the leading causes of suicide in India.

The theme of World Suicide Prevention Day 2022 is "Creating Hope through Action", and that reflected the need for collective action to address this public health issue. Suicide is a growing social problem in every society. And it is the duty of Social Work students to help people with suicide tendency to overcome this problem. They should be aware of NGOs that focus on suicide prevention activities. Students should also talk to and comfort the depressed people from lower rungs of the society who suffer on account of discrimination and depression. This awareness programme will help in understanding the barriers found in the society for discussing the topic of mental disorders and suicides. Discussing this issue openly is considered indecent and abhorred in many societies. This should change", he added.

Mrs. Leema Thomas, Psychologist, Rejoice Counselling Centre, Karaikudi, delivered the thematic address. She referred to the suicide triggering points and suicide prevention methods. She insisted on strengthening the social factors through which we could prevent many suicide attempts. She also explained how symptoms like social withdrawal, isolation and depression are predictors

of suicide. She said that suicide rate in Asian countries are very less when compared to Western countries and attributed it to the strong family units and the parenting interventions in the East. She also emphasized the importance of social work in preventing suicide, suicidal attempts and self-harm.

Mr. S. Pragadeeswaran , Head, Department of Social Work, Athma Hospital, Trichy, highlighted the significance of developing a positive mental health for a happier life and he shared some of the case studies that he encountered in his practice. He also referred to a lot of facts and myths about suicidal symptoms and attempts. He pointed out that every suicide death is due to prior suicide attempt. He discussed different terminologies of suicide that include attempted suicide, committed suicide, consummated suicide, para suicide and deliberate self harm. He hinted at the methods to be practised for positive mental health through an acronym called "EMI" which meant "Exercise, Meditation and Introspection".

Earlier in his welcome address Dr. A. Velusami, Head i/c, Department of Social Work said that the overall aim of the event was to create awareness about suicide prevention worldwide and another purpose was to promote preventive measures to stop self-harm and suicide attempts. Education" (NCTLISE-2022)

A Two-Day "National Conference on Changing Information Landscape and Its Transformation in LIS Education" (NCTLISE-2022) was inaugurated on 02.09.2022 at Alagappa University, Karaikudi. Raja Rammohun Roy Library Foundation (RRRLF)-sponsored Conference was hosted by the Department of Library and Information Science, Alagappa University.

Inaugurating the Conference Prof. G. Ravi, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, referred to the significance of a well-equipped modern library in rendering great help to a scholar who is passionate in his

pursuit of innovative research. He said that the invention of printing made an enormous impact which is beyond human expectation and imagination. Printed materials can never be replaced, he added. But at the same time with the advent of digitization, getting information and acquiring knowledge have become easier for researchers. In today's world of knowledge explosion, judicious use of resources is very important for focused studies. The modern technology helps in the selection of the right materials and it is a boon for the scholar.

Making a reference to the declining habit of reading among the modern youth, he said that books are unfailing companions to lonely individuals. "Reading books can change the world; reading reduces stress; reading strengthens the functioning of the brain; reading helps in acquiring knowledge; reading enhances one's vocabulary in the subject concerned and reading builds confidence. In short, reading makes a full man, as said by an English essayist". He concluded his speech by saying that "changing scenario demands updating of knowledge on the part of LIS professionals.

Dwelling on the impact of digitization and consequent transformation in library and information services in the present era, Prof. Pravakar Rath, Senior Professor from Mizoram University, in his keynote address, stated that the role and responsibility of the LIS Professionals have undergone tremendous changes in the changing information landscape; he added that quality services in this field can only be assured through innovative services and best practices to meet the changing needs of the users. "An innovative librarian explores, applies and discovers applications to change the system that provides impactful services. With the successful digital library initiatives, libraries have started connecting with each other through library networks and share their resources to avoid duplication of money, manpower and material. In this regard, library resource sharing networks and consortia are a boon to academic and research community".

A compendium containing research articles was released by the Vice- Chancellor and the first copy was received by Prof. Pravakar Rath.



Prof. M. Sadik Batcha of Annamalai University, who presented the overview of the conference, said this conference would provide a platform for interaction among the library professionals and digital library experts, researchers, academicians, and students on the needed changes to transform library and information science education and training and it would also help to adopt, implement and utilize the emerging Digital Library and all other available new technologies and their applications toward shaping information paradigm to bridge the digital divide through knowledge sharing and would provide an opportunity to identify the strengths and gaps in the library system and to suggest new models, policies and mechanisms for reshaping the traditional libraries into next generation libraries.

Earlier Prof. S. Thanuskodi, Dean, Faculty of Arts and Head of the Department of Library and Information Science and the Organizing Secretary of the Conference, welcomed the gathering. Dr. C. Baskaran, Librarian, Central Library, Alagappa University, proposed a vote of thanks.

International Literacy Day Organised

The International Literacy Day was conducted on 16.9.2022 at Alagappa University under the auspices of the Department of Library and Information Science.



Presiding over the event Prof. G. Ravi, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, said at the time of India's Independence, only 2 out of 10 people were literates at the national level. But in 2022 India's literacy rate is 77.7 percent owing to the efforts of the governments. He added that Tamil Nadu's literacy rate is 82.9 percent, with male literacy constituting 87.9 percent and female literacy rate is 77.9 percent. The overall enrollment rate in higher education in India is 27.1 percent. But the total enrollment rate in higher education in Tamil Nadu is twice the national average i.e. 51.4 percent. He further said that countries like Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark and Switzerland have achieved 100 percent literacy in the world. Countries like North Korea and Cuba excel in fields like agriculture and medicine only because of education. He also said that literacy means knowing and studying what is necessary for life along with the curriculum prescribed for study. Japan is the third richest country in the world and it is because of people's hard work and quality education system prevailing there.

Prof. V. Thiruvalluvan, Vice-Chancellor, Tamil University, Thanjavur, delivered the keynote address. He stated there is a co-relation between literacy rate and allround progress of a nation. Education enhances the quality of life of individuals and it is, indeed, a blessing. He dwelt on the qualities one has to nurture in his early education. "Besides learning subjects the youth should learn moral and ethical ways of living which ancient Tamil Literary texts highlight. There should be gratitude and loyalty and these are the most important traits one has to cultivate. Purity of mind is very important. Experience is real life. Students should remember the saying that reading makes a full man. Education should be used properly for a righteous living and students should make reading a daily routine. Those who control the mind and concentrate on studies become scholars".

Prof. A. Narayanamoorthy, Dean Research, offered felicitation. He said there is no development without education. If literacy develops, the country will automatically progress in all sectors. He exhorted the students to go to libraries and read a lot of books for their personal elevation and national development.

There were problems of disrupted loan book, liquidity crisis and business contraction risk. Borrowers faced crisis in getting required funds. Employees faced job losses. Business organisations faced reduction in sales and declining profitability, Hence banks needed plans to protect the customers and they have taken concrete steps to reposition themselves for a recalibrated future.

The increased preference towards alternative distribution channels namely net banking & mobile banking, increase in customer expectations and the pressure on growth in revenues necessitated the banks to have an eye on strategies and brand issues which will define their future. The heavy decrease in cash flows of customers has resulted in huge NPA for banks and steps were initiated by the Government of India & Reserve Bank of India through a slew of measures like 15 basis point cut in the repo rate, reduction in the cash reserve ratio etc. It was opportune time for the public sector banks to offer better technology services through multiple digital channels resulting in a multiple channel mix. Digital agility alone will pave the way for success. Due to the availability of 1.6 lakh bank branches and 2.1 lakh ATM, cash needs of customers and payment services were facilitated. He said that banks should build up their capacity and capital to support the market and added that the banks responded well to meet the challenges imposed by COVID 19 providing the needed credit support. It would ultimately increase the trust & confidence of the public towards the banking industry in the long run.



Prof. S. Karuppuchamy, another Member of the VC Officiating Committee, in his inaugural address, said that after the unstable times posed by COVID 19, public sector banks have started to provide more micro finance & other financial assistance to the downtrodden sections of the society.
